	1. A voter that is qualified as exempt from presenting a Photo ID is able to present only a valid voter registration certificate to be qualified to vote.
	2. A 69 year old voter that presents a driver's license that expired 4 ½ years ago is presenting an acceptable Form A ID.
	3. The address on the ID presented has to match the address in our system.
	4. The person working the check-in station should compare the name on the ID presented to the name on the List of Registered Voters (Laptop).
	5. An ID that says William Smith is an exact match to the List of Registered Voters (laptop) that says Bill Smith.
	6. A voter that does not possess a List A form of ID but presents a current Voter Registration Certificate also has to complete a Reasonable Impediment Declaration.
