The meeting was called to order at 8:05 a.m. and immediately recessed to go into Closed/Executive Session to discuss the matters listed on today's agenda.

The Closed/Executive Session recessed to be reconvened at 2:00 p.m. and the Open Meeting reconvened at 9:49 a.m..

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the invocation was delivered by Mike Loving.

Motion was made by Commissioner Easingwood, seconded by Commissioner Weeks to approve the Consent Agenda as presented:

Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion. Motion carried.

There was no action on any matter discussed in the Closed/Executive Session

George Morris of Templeton Construction gave a brief update on the construction of the new jail. No action was taken.

Judge Brown informed the Court that of the three public members drawn on January 11, 2000 to serve on the 2000 Salary Grievance Committee, two accepted and one declined to serve, so another name must be drawn as a replacement. He then drew the name Rebecca Papazian from the remaining names in the 1999 Grand Jury Pool. A notification will be sent to Ms. Papazian by the County Clerk.

Mr. Ronald Perry, Assistant Fire Chief of the Pecan Creek Volunteer Fire Department requested that the Court postpone the outdoor burning ban. He stated that he had spoken with other area volunteers and Chiefs and they feel that the burn ban needs to be clarified and he requested that the Chiefs be allowed to give their insight to any ban. The Judge noted that the state has a burning ban in effect already, but the County can specify areas and combustibles. Motion was then made by Commissioner Weeks, seconded by Commissioner Friend to pass this item until next week. Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried

Judge Brown noted that on recommendation on counsel, agenda item #12 "consider Tom Green County Association with Sheriffs of Texas Agreed Response (STAR) Program) would be taken up later when the County's legal counsel arrives.

Mr. Jerry Ruiz reported to the Court on the progress he had made for the Census Volunteer Program and stated the need for funding to cover expenses. It was noted that the County has provided the office space along with maintenance and housekeeping. It was suggested that Mr. Ruiz return to the Court after he contacts the City and San Angelo Independent School District in regard to the funding those entities will provide. Judge Brown then presented his resolution for the record

appointing Jerry G. Ruiz as Chairperson of the Tom Green County Census 2000 Complete Count Committee (resolution recorded with these minutes). No action was taken.

Library Director Larry Justiss addressed the Court concerning the use of Texpress package delivery for the library. He noted that the program is subsidized by the state and would cost \$1,000 annually as opposed to approximately \$3600 being paid now. Commissioner Weeks made the motion to approve the Texpress Agreement (recorded with these minutes) and the motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood. Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Judge Brown presented the lease agreement between Tom Green County and the Tom Green County Tax Appraisal District. He stated that the agreement is for \$46,843.20 annually plus \$10 per month per employee parking space. Motion was made by Judge Brown and seconded by Commissioner Bookter to approve the agreement (recorded with these minutes). Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Mike Tucker of the Thunderbird Rural Transportation System presented the semi-annual report to the Court. Motion was made by Judge Brown, seconded by Commissioner Friend to accept the report for the record (recorded with these minutes). Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Agenda item "Consider Courtroom Sound System for Courtroom E" was passed for more information.

Commissioner Friend made the motion to approve naming a private road off FM380 in Precinct #1 Vidler Road for 911 purposes. There was a short discussion and then Commissioner Friend revised his motion to state "with payment to be made by the landowners. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and it carried...

Motion was made by Commissioner Easingwood, seconded by Commissioner Friend to accept the Treasurer's report for January, 2000. All voted in favor of the motion and it carried (report recorded with these minutes).

Daryl McCurdy of the Collections Department presented the monthly Collections report for the Court's information. No action was taken.

Commissioner Friend made a motion to authorize the County Judge to sign the Administration Services Agreement with Zesch and Pickett for administration of the cafeteria plan (agreement recorded with these minutes). Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Agenda item "Consider Annual Report of Tom Green County Historical Commission" was passed until Golda Foster could be present.

Thomas Fryer of Information Technology gave a brief update on the County Computer Upgrade. No action was taken.

Herb Hooker with SK engineering presented the Infrastructure Development Plan for Fruitland Farm Manufactured Home Rental Community. Mr. Ralph Goble spoke to the Court about his concerns with the development. After very lengthy discussion, Judge Brown made the motion to "approve the Fruitland Farm Manufactured Home Rental Community Infrastructure Development Plan and file the plat as presented and incorporate into the acceptance, the four general notes listed on the development plan, the typical installation, the filtration units, the County road design and the rest of the infrastructure development plan and subject to the recording of an acceptable joint use agreement for the off setting property". Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion. Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

The following is from agenda item #22: Golda Foster presented the annual report of the Tom Green County historical Commission. Judge Brown made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Weeks to accept the Tom Green County Historical Commission report for 1999 for the record (report recorded with these minutes). Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

The following is from agenda item #12: Attorney Keith Davis addressed the Court concerning the Sheriff's of Texas Agreed Response (STAR) Program which is a loosely knit entity created of law enforcement officials and officers whose purpose is to address things of public need and necessity such as calamities, uprisings and other things of that nature. He noted that he

had read the operational agreement which was executed by the Sheriff. Attorney Davis identified the areas of concern and the possible exposure to the County and the Sheriff's Department. Sheriff Gray advised that the operational agreement is no longer being used. He also noted that the Sheriff advised that the operational agreement is null and void and a new one has not been executed. Mr. Davis recommended the Sheriff submit a letter to the program director of STAR advising that the Sheriff's Office, including it's personnel and equipment and Tom Green County are not associated with the STAR Program. Judge Brown then made the motion "to adopt a resolution stating that Tom Green County is not now nor has ever been a member or a participant in the STAR Sheriff's of Texas Agreed Response Program and has not ever authorized the approval of any agreements pursuant to that organization". Commissioner Bookter seconded the motion. Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Auditor Ed Sturdivant, representing the insurance committee, informed the Court that the committee had reviewed a recent amendment to the health plan involving weight control medications. The recommendation of the committee is to rescind the amendment which was approved on December 21, 1999 and approve the addition of lipase inhibitors to the health plan as set by URM, Inc. (Utilization Resource Management, Inc.) Commissioner Weeks made the motion to rescind the Commissioners' amendment to the Tom Green County Health Plan which was approved December 21<sup>st</sup> that said "approve the addition of lipase inhibitors (i.e. Xenical) to the Lipase Inhibitor Criteria as set forth by URM, Inc. with the exception of the employees currently using these drugs and to be effective as of February 15, 2000. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion. Judge Brown and all commissioners voted in favor of the motion and it carried.

Agenda item "consider setting speed limit of 50 mph on Burma Road" was passed until next week.

Agenda item "Consider Consumer Price index increase with Correctional Foodservice Management for food services for Detention Facility" was passed until errors in the contract can be corrected.

Agenda item "Consider issues relating to Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactures Home Rental Community Development Regulations was passed for further information.

Motion was made by Judge Brown and seconded by Commissioner Friend to approve the following FY2000 Line item transfers:
