Tom Green County Commissioner's Court April 3, 2001

The Commissioners' Court of Tom Green County, Texas, met in Regular Session April 3, 2001, in the Edd B. Keyes Building, with the following members present:

Clayton Friend, Commissioner of Precinct #1 Karl Bookter, Commissioner of Precinct #2 Jodie R. Weeks, Commissioner of Precinct #3 Richard Easingwood, Commissioner of Precinct #4 Michael D. Brown, County Judge Elizabeth McGill, County Clerk and Ex-officio Clerk of the Commissioners' Court

Judge Brown called the meeting to order at 9:33 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Commissioner Easingwood gave the invocation.

Judge Brown moved to accept the Consent Agenda, with the exclusion of item F., as presented:

A. The approval of the Minutes from the Regular Session, March 27, 2001.

B. Approved to pay the bills in the Minutes of Accounts Allowable in the amount of \$1,029,506.13 and approved the Purchase Orders in the amount of \$38,508.64.

C. Accepted Personnel Actions as presented:

- D. Approved verification of training hours obtained by County Clerk, Elizabeth McGill and recorded with these minutes.
- E. Approved request by AEP-WTU for easement and right –of-way for Overhead Communication Line Installation in Christoval.
- F. Withdrawn
- G. Approved Verizon Southwest request to bury communication line in County right-of-way in Precinct 1.
- H. Approved Verizon Southwest request to bury communication lines in County right-of-way in Precinct 4.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Herb Straach – Templeton Construction announced to the Court that the Jail Commission made their inspection on the jail March 29th and 30th, 2001. There were a few minor deficiency brought to our attention but they were taken care of Friday afternoon and by 5:00 P.M. Friday, Mary Burns, Jail Commander, had faxed to the Jail Commission that all of the deficiencies had been taken care of. Masonry work is proceeding on the front entrance and the electricians are working on Phase III as well as the concrete work. Mill work bids have been taken and submitted for approval. Phase II is on hold until the prisoners are moved into Phase I.

Judge Brown moved to accept the bid from S&S Cabinets for mill work in Phase II at a price of \$3630.00 for red oak. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor.

Gary McClure – Templeton Construction reported on issues to be resolved regarding the leaks in the roof of the Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Center. Steel erector will take responsibility for construction errors and other problems such as extra downspouts needed to be added and abuse to the flat roof will need to be addressed by the County. Erector's attorney has requested that either Templeton or the County sign an agreement to pay for any leaks that are not the result of the erector. Keith Davis, attorney for the County, recommended that a change order for the additional work, the down spouts, repair work that is our responsibility or that of Southwest Keys. Two sheetrock ceilings and ceiling tiles have been damaged.

Commissioner Friend moved to authorize Gary McClure, of Templeton Construction, to negotiate, and act on behalf of the County, and to oversee or designate an overseer on his behalf to review and negotiate in the best interest of the County, without administration cost to the County. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor of the motion.

Judge Brown moved to adopt the Proclamation designating April, 2001 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month". Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor. Proclamation recorded with these minutes.

Debra Brown ,Hope House & CASA , extended an invitation for everyone to come to a ribbon cutting ceremony at the County Library , April 24, 2001 at 5:30 P.M. , for the Grand Opening of the "Kid's Smart" Resource Center . Carla Payne, Assault Victim Services, presented blue ribbon pins to those in attendance to signify Child Abuse Prevention. The Court complimented both agencies for the job they are doing.

Larry Justice, Tom Green Library Director, explained to the Court that this is National Library Week, but the Tom Green County Library wished to extend this to the entire month, in order to fulfill all the programs they have planned. Karen Vavricka, Associate Director, announced that today, from 12:00 to 1:00 P.M. that the 10th Annual "Read to Me" March around the Courthouse would take place with kids from all over town and Foster Grandparents participating.

Judge Brown moved to adopt the Proclamation proclaiming "April 2nd –30th, 2001 as Tom Green County Library Month". Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor. Proclamation is recorded with these minutes.

Commissioner Friend moved authorize the Purchasing Department to mail bids for RFB 01-020 "Parking Lot Expansion" at the Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Facility and to set April 30th, 2001, as the day for the opening of the bids.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Weeks moved to approve mailing bids for RFB 01-019 "One (1) 15 Passenger Van" and bids to be opened April 23,2001. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Friend moved to extend the Hwy 67/277 lease between Gary Halfmann and Tom Green County for 5 years. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Bookter moved to accept the bid proposal submitted by Texas State Bank as our County Depository Bank for 4 years with a 2 year option. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor. (On file in County Treasurer's Office)

Commissioner Friend moved to accept the Treasurer's Monthly Report as presented. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor. Recorded with these minutes.

Commissioner Easingwood moved to approve the Professional Services Agreement with Gutierrez, Smouse, Wilmut & Assoc., Inc. and Tom Green County to prepare plans and specifications for water facility improvements- phase III, Christoval water system at a cost of \$27,600.00. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Virginia Corder, was the name drawn to serve on the County Salary Grievance Committee to replace person previously drawn who declined to serve.

There were no issues relating to the Tom Green County Subdivision Regulations and no line item transfers.

Market Commentary

Times are changing. Fears of "irrational exuberance" just a short time ago have been replaced by fears of recession and stagflation. The primary question for the month of March will be whether the Federal Reserve will cut interest rates by 25 or 50 basis points. The Fed will keep a close eye on economic statistics scheduled for release between now and the March 20th Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting.

On the downside (making a 50 basis point cut more likely), manufacturing has slowed to recessionary levels, energy prices are extraordinarily high-cutting into personal consumption. Corporations are cutting earnings forecasts left and right, consumer sentiment is plummeting and the stock market has not only erased all of its January gains, but many stocks are currently trading at 1998 levels.

All in all things look pretty gloomy; however, there may be reasons for hope that might imply the economy is just slowing down-not headed for a recession. On the upside, housing starts for January were robust, auto sales for January were healthy, retail sales are holding steady, labor markets, though softening, remain tight and housing starts for January were strong. Add to this an aggressive Fed, who has already cut rates by 100 basis points so far this year, and we might see the economy headed for a recovery by the fall. The market is currently pricing in a 50 basis point cut by March 20th.

What about inflation? The latest Producer Price Index (PPI) and Consumer Price Index (CPI) releases for January came in much higher than anticipated, surprising markets with hints of inflation. This data is problematic, but unlikely to keep the Fed from cutting rates. Fed Chairman Alan Greenspan will be more concerned with the struggling stock market, sinking consumer confidence and the collapse in manufacturing. The Fed will not want to run the risk of damaging an already fragile economic environment.

Sector Review:

Treasuries: The Treasury yield curve continues to steepen. With expectations that the Fed will continue its aggressive easing stance, securities that mature sooner (shorter dated securities) are in favor. Fed eases have an immediate impact on shorter dated securities while the yield on longer dated securities are affected by expectations for inflation, implications of monetary policy and uncertainty over the future direction of interest rates.

The Treasury also had its last one-year T-bill auction this month, which has caused bills to rally more drastically due to the lack of supply in the one-year area going forward. Natural buyers of one-year bills will be forced to look in the 6-month or two-year sectors for liquidity, adding a premium to these instruments, thereby lowering their yield. Toward the end of February, 3-month bills were trading around a 4.78% yield, 6-month bills at a 4.63% yield and 1-year bills at a 4.56% yield. Thirty-year bonds were yielding 5.35% and 10-year treasuries were yielding 4.95%.

Repo: Overnight repurchase agreements traded more or less at 5.40% for most of February. We will probably see a drop of about 50 basis points in overnight reportates if the Fed eases by that much in March.

Commercial Paper: Sixty-day commercial paper rates have fallen since the beginning of February as the probability of a 50 basis point rate cut by the Fed became more likely. Rates started the month around a 5.30% discount and ended the month at a 4.85% discount. We are keeping our average maturity on the long side in order to capture as much yield as possible in this declining rate environment.

Agencies: Sixty-day agency discount notes held steady around a 5.23% discount for most of the month, but have recently declined and were trading around a 4.93% discount by the end of February. Due to increased supply, agency discount notes have been trading at historically cheap levels compared to commercial paper.

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PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

TOM GREEN COUNTY, TEXAS, as CLIENT engages Gutierrez, Smouse, Wilmut & Assoc., Inc. as ENGINEER to perform professional services for the assignment described as follows:

PREPARE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR WATER FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS - PHASE III, Christoval water system - as further described in the paragraph below, Tom Green County, Texas, 2001 TCDP Contract No. _____.

WATER FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS: Construction of water system improvements including approximately 2,100 linear feet of 6-inch PVC water line; 2,000 linear feet of 2-inch PVC water line; one (1) 6-inch flushing valves; seven (7) 6-inch gate valves and boxes; four (4) 2-inch gate valve and box; plant piping; water plant protection structure; protection structure electrical; and miscellaneous fittings.

- I. SERVICES: ENGINEER agrees to perform Basic Services and Additional Services in conformance with the following descriptions, definitions, terms and conditions.
 - A. BASIC SERVICES: ENGINEER will perform these services in three phases:
 - 1. Design Phase: ENGINEER will discuss the assignment with CLIENT, arrange for field surveys, as required; prepare final contract drawings and construction cost estimates; and prepare necessary bidding documents.
 - 2. Bidding Phase: After completion of Design Phase and when authorized by CLIENT, ENGINEER will assist CLIENT in securing and analyzing bids, recommend award of construction contract and prepare construction contract.
 - 3. Construction Phase: After completion of Bidding Phase and when authorized by CLIENT, ENGINEER will issue the notice to proceed to the contractor; consult with CLIENT during construction; transmit instructions of CLIENT to Contractor; periodically visit construction site to observe progress and quality of work; interpret drawings and specifications; review shop drawings, material and equipment test and Contractor's pay estimates; observe the completed construction for conformity to contract documents; issue to Contractor a Certificate of Completion; prepare "As Built" drawings of the completed project at which time Basic Services shall be deemed complete.
 - B. ADDITIONAL SERVICES: All work performed by ENGINEER which is either described in this paragraph or not included in the Basic Services defined above, shall constitute Additional Services. These shall include:
 - 1. Travel and subsistence to points other than ENGINEER'S or CLIENT's offices and project site;
 - 2. Copies of construction documents in excess of five (5) sets;

- 3. Revisions to substantially completed construction documents or approved preliminary documents occasioned by changes in scope of work;
- 4. Soil borings, soil, mill, shop and laboratory tests;
- 5. Expense of Field Surveys, construction staking and related office computations and drafting;
- 6. Resident project representation;
- 7. Special reports or studies, property maps, plats, reparation of environmental statements, applications for permits or grants, appearances before regulatory agencies, and required filing fees;
- 8. Services as an expert witness including preparation of engineering data and reports on behalf of the CLIENT or in connection with litigation or other controversies, or in consultation with CLIENT or attorneys;
- 9. Renderings, exhibits or scale models;
- 10. Additional or extended services during construction made necessary by work damaged by fire or other cause during construction; defective or neglected work of Contractor; prolongation of construction contract time by more than 20%, acceleration of work schedule involving services beyond normal working hours; or default under construction contract due to delinquency or insolvency;
- 11. Services after issuance of Certificate of Completion;
- 12. Services to investigate existing conditions or facilities or to make measured drawings thereof, or to verify accuracy of drawings or other information furnished by CLIENT;
- 13. Other services not otherwise included in this Agreement or not customarily furnished in accordance with generally accepted engineering practice.
- II. COMPENSATION: CLIENT agrees to pay ENGINEER for above described services in accordance with the following description, definitions, terms and conditions.
 - A. BASIC SERVICES: Compensation will be a lump sum for services in each phase as scheduled below:

B. ADDITIONAL SERVICES: Compensation will be in accordance with the ENGINEER's most current Schedule of Fees for each listed category of engineer, draftsman, resident project representative or other employee. A copy of the most current schedule which is attached hereto as Appendix "A" and incorporated herein for all purposes. Surveying subcontract and resident project representative special services are estimated to total ELEVEN THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$11,000.00). The ENGINEER will issue a new Schedule of Fees each January.

- III. PAYMENTS: ENGINEER will invoice CLIENT monthly in amounts based on ENGINEER's estimate of the portion of the Basic Services completed, plus charges for Additional Services performed. CLIENT agrees to promptly pay ENGINEER at his office in MIDLAND, TEXAS, the full amount of each such invoice upon receipt.
- IV. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS: All documents, including original drawings, estimates, specifications, field notes and data are and shall remain the property of the ENGINEER. CLIENT may at his expense obtain a set of reproducible record copies of drawings and other documents, but agrees that he will use such copies solely in connection with the project covered by this Agreement and for no other purpose.
- V. COST ESTIMATES: Cost estimates prepared by the ENGINEER represent his best judgement as a design professional familiar with the construction industry. It is recognized, however, that the ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor, materials or equipment, over the Contractor's method of determining bid prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions. Accordingly, the ENGINEER cannot and does not guarantee that bids will not vary from any cost estimate prepared by him.
- VI. INSURANCE: ENGINEER agrees to maintain workers' compensation insurance to cover all of its own personnel engaged in performing services for CLIENT under this Agreement. ENGINEER also agrees to maintain public liability insurance covering claims against ENGINEER for damages resulting from bodily injury, death or property damage from accidents arising in the course of services performed under this Agreement. ENGINEER will provide professional liability insurance covering professional acts, errors and omissions.
- VII. LIABILITY LIMITATION: The CLIENT recognizes that the ENGINEER's fee includes allowance for funding a variety of risks which affect the ENGINEER's potential for human error. In order for the CLIENT to obtain the benefits of a fee which includes a lesser allowance for risk funding, the CLIENT agrees to limit the ENGINEER's liability to the CLIENT and all construction contractors arising from the ENGINEER's professional acts, error, or omissions, such that the total aggregate liability of the ENGINEER to all those named shall not exceed \$27,600 or the ENGINEER's total fee for the services rendered on this project, whichever is greater.
- VIII. TERMINATION:
 - A. CONDITIONS OF TERMINATION: This Agreement may be terminated without cause at any time prior to completion of ENGINEER's services by the CLIENT upon seven days written notice to the address of record. Such termination shall release either party from all obligations of this Agreement, except as specified in paragraph VIII.B below.
 - B. COMPENSATION PAYABLE ON TERMINATION: On termination, by either CLIENT or ENGINEER, CLIENT shall pay ENGINEER the full amount specified in paragraph II.A. with respect to any phase of Basic Engineering Services which has been completed plus an amount for all Basic Services performed to date of termination in accordance with the ENGINEER's most current Schedule of Fees for each listed category of employee (including all Reimbursable Expenses incurred).

REPORTS AND INFORMATION: The ENGINEER, at such times and in such forms as the CLIENT may require, shall furnish the CLIENT such periodic reports as it may request pertaining to the work or services undertaken pursuant to this Agreement, the cost and obligations incurred or to be incurred in connection therewith, and any other matters covered by this Agreement.
- X. RECORDS AND AUDITS: The ENGINEER shall maintain accounts and records, including personnel, property and financial records, adequate to identify and account for all cost pertaining to the contract and such other records as may be deemed necessary by the CLIENT to assure proper accounting for all project funds, both Federal and non-Federal shares. These records will be made available for audit purposes to the CLIENT or any authorized representative, and will be retained for three (3) years after the expiration of this contract unless permission to destroy them is granted by the CLIENT.
- XI. FINDINGS CONFIDENTIAL: All of the reports, information, data, etc. prepared or assembled by ENGINEER under this Agreement are confidential and ENGINEER agrees that they shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of CLIENT.
- XII. COPYRIGHT: No report, maps, or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the ENGINEER.
- XIII. EFFECTIVE DATES OF CONTRACT: The effective starting date of this Contract shall be the contract start date for this project as established by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs. The effective ending date of this Contract is upon completion of the project and conditions outlined in this Contract. Termination of Contract also subject to condition of VIII. - Termination.
- XIV. INTERESTS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY: No member of the governing body the of CLIENT, and no other officer, employee, or agent of the CLIENT who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of the program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this Contract; and ENGINEER shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.
- XV. INTERESTS OF OTHER LOCAL PUBLIC OFFICIALS: No member of the governing body of the CLIENT and no other public official of such CLIENT, who exercised any function or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of the program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this Contract; and ENGINEER shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.
- XVI. INTEREST OF ENGINEER AND EMPLOYEES: ENGINEER covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire interest, direct or indirect, in the project area or any parcels therein or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of his services hereunder. ENGINEER further covenants that in the performance of this Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed.
- XVII. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY: During the performance of this contract, the ENGINEER agrees as follows:

- A. The ENGINEER will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, sex, color, handicap or national origin. The ENGINEER will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, creed, sex, color, handicap or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The ENGINEER agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the CLIENT setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
- B. The ENGINEER will, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the ENGINEER, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, sex, handicap or national origin.
- C. The ENGINEER will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by this contract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- D. The ENGINEER will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- E. The ENGINEER will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965 and by the rules, regulations and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his/her books, records, and accounts by the CLIENTS's auditor and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations and orders.
- F. In the event of the ENGINEER's non-compliance with the non-compliance clauses of this Agreement or with any of such rules, regulations or orders, this Agreement may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the ENGINEER may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- G. The ENGINEER will include the provisions of the paragraphs (A) through (G) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The ENGINEER will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the CLIENT may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for non-compliance: Provided, however, that in the event the ENGINEER becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by

- XVIII. CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964: Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.
- XIX. SECTION 109 OF THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974: No person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color, national origin, or sex be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available under this title.
- XX. "SECTION 3" COMPLIANCE IN THE PROVISION OF TRAINING, EMPLOYMENT AND BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES:
 - A. The work to be performed under this contract is on a project assisted under a program providing direct Federal financial assistance from the Department of Housing and Urban Development and is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u. Section 3 requires that to the greatest extent feasible opportunities for training and employment be given lower income residents of the project area concerns which are located in, or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the area of the project.
 - B. The parties to this contract will comply with the provisions of said Section 3 and the regulations issued pursuant thereto by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development set forth in 24 C.F.R. 235, and all applicable rules and orders of the Department issued thereunder prior to the execution of this contract. The parties to this contract certify and agree that they are under no contractual or other disability which would prevent them from complying with these requirements.
 - C. The ENGINEER will include this Section 3 clause in every subcontract for work in connection with the project and will, at the direction of the applicant for or recipient of Federal financial assistance, take appropriate action pursuant to the subcontract upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of regulations issued by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, 24 C.F.R. Part 135. The ENGINEER will not subcontract with any subcontractor where it has notice or knowledge that the latter has been found in violation of regulations under 24 C.F.R. Part 135 and will not let any subcontract unless the subcontractor has first provided it with a preliminary statement of ability to comply with the requirements of these regulations.
 - D. Compliance with the provisions of Section 3, the regulations set forth in 24 C.F.R. Part 135, and all applicable rules and orders of the Department issued hereunder prior to the execution of the contract, shall be a condition of the federal financial assistance provided to the project, binding upon the applicant of recipient for such assistance, its successors and assigns. Failure to fulfill these requirements shall subject the applicant or recipient, its contractors

and subcontractors, its successors and assigns. Failure to fulfill these requirements shall subject the applicant or recipient, its contractors and subcontractors, its successors and assigns to those sanctions specified by the grant, or loan agreement or contract through which federal assistance is provided, and to such sanctions as are specified by 24 C.F.R. Part 135.

- XXI. SECTION 503 HANDICAPPED (IF \$2,500 OR OVER) AFFIRMATIVE ACTION FOR HANDICAPPED WORKERS:
 - A. The ENGINEER will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant for employment is qualified.
 - B. The ENGINEER agrees to take affirmative action to employ, advance in employment and otherwise treat qualified handicapped individuals without discrimination based upon their physical or mental handicap in all employment practices such as the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment, advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
 - C. In the event of the contractor's non-compliance with the requirements of this clause, actions for non-compliance may be taken in accordance with the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to the Act.
 - D. The ENGINEER agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices in a form to be prescribed by the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, provided by or through the contracting officer. Such notices shall state the ENGINEER's obligation under the law to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment qualified handicapped employees and applicants for employment, and the rights of applicants and employees.
 - E. The ENGINEER will notify each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract understanding, that the ENGINEER is bound by the terms of Section 503 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and is committed to take affirmative action to employ and advance in employment physically and mentally handicapped individuals.
 - F. The ENGINEER will include the provisions of this clause in every subcontract or purchase order of \$2,500 or more unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary issued pursuant to Section 503 of the Act, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the Director of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs may direct to enforce such provisions, including action for non-compliance.

SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS: CLIENT and ENGINEER each binds himself, and his partner, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party of this Agreement and to partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of such other party in respect to all covenants of this Agreement. Neither CLIENT not ENGINEER shall assign, sublet, or transfer his interest in this Agreement without written consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed as giving any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than CLIENT and ENGINEER.
- XXV. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: This instrument contains the entire Agreement between CLIENT and ENGINEER.
- XXVI. INVALIDATION: If this Agreement is not executed by CLIENT within 30 days of date tendered, it shall become invalid unless ENGINEER extends the time in writing.
- XXVII. MODIFICATIONS: No one has authority to make variations in, or additions to the terms of this Agreement on behalf of ENGINEER other than one of its Officers or Managers, and then only in writing signed by him.
