- F. Approved Concho Rural Water Corporation's request to lay 6 inch water line in County right-of-way along John Curry Road and bore under said road at a minimum depth of 30 inches.
- G. Passed the solid waste report.
- H. Declared May 29, 2001, July 3, 2001 and October 16<sup>th</sup>, 2001 as fifth Tuesdays and cancelled Commissioners' Court on those dates.
- I. Approved contract Amendment that will extend current contract for reimbursement of Attorney General child support payments through August 31,2001.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Mike Freeman announce that the prisoners have been moved into the new jail and the kitchen has been moved over and is fully operational. Don Killam said that extra keys will be ordered and that they take about 3 to 4 weeks to come in.

Judge Brown moved to adopt the Proclamation designating April 22-28, 2001 as "**National Crime Victim Rights Week**" in Tom Green County. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted favor. Proclamation recorded with these minutes. Rita Guthrie thanked the Court for their continued support of the rights of crime victims.

Commissioner Weeks moved to approve the Resolution to Authorize the County Attorney to Apply to the Office of the Attorney General for a Grant to Pay for the Salary of the Victim/Witness Assistance Coordinator for the 2001-2002 grant year. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor of the motion.

Judge Brown moved to authorize the Information Technology Department to transfer a computer into the County Attorney's office to be used by volunteers to input data into the grant managers software. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Friend moved to authorize \$100.00 to assist in funding the Tom Green County entry in **Relay for Life team** to benefit the American Cancer Society and to be taken from the Commissioner Courts Office Supplies line item. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Bookter explained that the trees at the Courthouse were badly damaged by the storm in 1995 and that trees needed to be planted now in order to have replacements when the older trees are gone. Commissioner Bookter and Horticulturist John Begnaud surveyed the landscape and determined that a minimum of eight trees needs to be interplanted to maintain the beauty of the Courthouse yard. Judge Brown appointed Commissioner Bookter to head a committee to seek donors to fund the replacement project. John Begnaud provided a list of a variety of trees that are drought resistant and adaptive for this area. The Master Gardeners have volunteered to be in charge of the planting. Commissioner Bookter suggested that a plaque be located in the foyer of one of the buildings listing the donors of the trees. Ron Perry of the Forestry Service offered some other sources that might be available to help with the project. Commissioner Bookter will work with the various agencies to implement a plan for restoration of the Courthouse yard. (List of trees recorded with these minutes.)

Mike Freeman and Debbie Davis presented the bids that were submitted for the Subscription Drugs for the Inmates. Debbie Davis stated that Food Basket on Main offered the best prices based on bottles of 100 pills per bottle. She explained that most of these bids are for generic brands and the no bids (NB) were because those are a set price and the same with all companies.

Commissioner Weeks moved to award the RFB 01-018 "Prescription Drugs for Inmates" to Food Basket Pharmacy (IGA) on Main Street to run from May 1, 2001 to April 30,2002 with an optional 1 extra year. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor. (Bids are recorded with these minutes.)

Michael Dalby, San Angelo Chamber of Commerce, addressed the Court regarding the County Purchasing Policies and STARTing in San Angelo (Schopping Today Adds Resources Tomorrow). Mr. Dalby explained that he appreciated the adoption of the County Purchasing Policy to give local bidders preference. He expressed his gratitude for any insight that might benefit the Chamber as a teaching tool to help educate their members with pointers that would help San Angelo grow and become a more competitive vendor. The Court thanked Mr. Dalby for coming and sharing ideas.

Commissioner Weeks moved to accept the donation of labor and materials, for use on Burma Road (Precinct #3), by Reece Albert Company per Transportation Code 252.159 for construction to meet or exceed Tom Green County Road construction standards. Motion was seconded by Judge Brown and all voted in favor.

After some discussion, the Court decided to pass on the final adoption of the Tom Green County Construction Specifications 1,2,3,4,5&6 until further revisions are made. Notification will be sent to the various contractors that operate within the County.

Judge Brown moved to adopt a Resolution of the Tom Green County Commissioners' Court Supporting the City of San Angelo Development Corporation's Application to the Economic Development Administration for a \$600,000.00 Grant to develop the San Angelo Industrial Park. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.


Dear Mr. Easingwood:

# **APPLICATION NARRATIVE**

## SECTION 1: PROBLEM STATEMENT AND DATA

In Tom Green County, there is a need for advocacy for the rights of crime victims throughout the criminal justice process and a need for regarding the rights and resources available to these victims within the community.

The Tom Green County Attorney's Office continues to have the potential to serve over 2,570 victims of crime in the next year. Since January of 2000, 875 victims of assault, 1,599 victims of domestic violence, and 96 victims of stalking were reported to the County Attorney's Office from the San Angelo Police Department and the Tom Green County Sheriff's Office. In addition to providing assistance to these victims, the County Attorney's Office has filed over 30 protective orders on behalf of victims of domestic violence. The Tom Green County Attorney's Office has one victim assistance coordinator funded by a grant form the Office of the Attorney General and one victim assistance coordinator funded by a Victims of Crime Act Grant. These two victim assistance coordinators notify assault victims, family violence victims, stalking victims, victims in need of protective orders, as well as victims that have suffered property losses from theft, criminal mischief, and other crimes of their rights and available services. In regard to the number of crime victim liaisons in Tom Green County, the San Angelo Police Department and the Tom Green County Sheriff's Office have one crime victim liaison each. The 119<sup>th</sup> and 51<sup>st</sup> District Attorney's Office has two victim assistance coordinators.

# SECTION 2: GOAL STATEMENT

Our goal is to increase the number of crime victims receiving assistance and services and increase the awareness of victims of their statutory rights including compensation, information, and assistance through a victim/witness assistance program.

## SECTION 3: TARGET GROUP

The victim/witness assistance program will target victims in Tom Green County of misdemeanor crimes including family violence and assault. Special focus will be given to victims of family violence due to the statistical evidence that this group is three times more likely to be re-victimized in the future. Because incidents of violence are growing and touch all parts of our community, the demographics of these victims will include all races, ages, sexes, ethnic groups, and social classes. This target group is expected to be between 2,000 and 3,000 crime victims.

### **SECTION 4: PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

The project will undertake a variety of activities to serve the target group as well as advocate on their behalf. Upon the receipt of a non-arrest report on a Family Violence

or Assault incident, the victim(s) will receive a letter from our office explaining services of our program as well as educational pamphlets on violence. In certain cases, these victims will also be contacted by phone to check on their well being and to discuss their needs and options at that time. When a report is received in which an arrest was made due to an assault or family violence, victims will be contacted by phone as soon as possible and given any referrals that are needed. These victims will also receive a program letter, educational pamphlets, and be notified of their rights as a victim.

On all incidents that are prosecuted, the Victim Assistance Advisor will act as a liaison throughout the entire process between the victim and the Criminal Justice System. Victims will be assisted in filing for victim compensation/restitution, filling out victim impact statements, and filling out applications for protective orders when necessary. Victim compensation filing will be aided through online service with the attorney general's office. Victims will be informed of court procedures and made aware of all court proceedings pertaining to their case. If the victim wishes to attend court proceedings, that person will be accompanied into the courtroom by either the victim coordinator or a trained volunteer. Once the court disposes the case, the victim will be informed of the defendant's sentence.

In the occasions when victims contact this office before contacting the police, they will be given appropriate referrals to community organizations and state programs. Victims will be counseled on their options and rights as the victim of a crime and on the process through which their case will follow. As awareness of the program grows within the community, we expect to see an increase in the number of victims turning to us for assistance.

In addition, the Victim Assistance Coordinator will assist victims, arrange for absences from work due to any need for cooperation and/or testimony in the prosecution of the criminal offense. These communications will also increase the awareness of employers in our community of the rights of crime victims.

The Victim Assistance Program will seek the support of volunteers throughout Tom Green County to assist the program through various activities. Volunteers will perform a variety of duties such as clerical work, victim follow-up, and accompaniment of victim to court.

The Victim Assistance Program will work together with such agencies as the San Angelo Police Department and the Tom Green County Sheriff's Office, Assault Victim Services and the Family Shelter, and the 51<sup>st</sup> and 119<sup>th</sup> District Attorney's Offices. As awareness of the program grows in the community, victims will be better served through these coordinated efforts of various agencies.

Pursuant to Chapter 56, Article 4 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, the Tom Green County Attorney's Office has employed a Victim Assistance Coordinator to ensure that crime victims are afforded rights granted by Chapter 56, Article 2. In 2000, there were at least 956 victims in the Tom Green County that have positively benefited through the use of Victim/Witness Assistance Program services in the last year. As awareness of the program grows through coordinated efforts with area agencies, we hope to increase the number of crime victims served to include 100% of victims that have made a report with the police. By educating these victims on the dynamics of violence and bodily injury, we hope to directly decrease instances of violence and bodily injury. The Victim/Witness Assistance Program will act as a liaison between law enforcement, the community and prosecution to provide the best services possible for crime victims to ensure that each person is treated with respect and receives assistance through the criminal justice process. By aiding victims through informing them of their statutory rights, informing them of all court proceedings, informing them and assisting them with compensation for crime victims, assisting them with their employers, and assisting them with victim's impact statements, we will be empowering victims who also feel helpless. The Victim/Witness Coordinator will be available to answer victim's questions on criminal investigation, filing of charges, court preparation and orientation in order to prevent further trauma to the victim. Not only will the victims benefit from services offered, prosecution efforts are also benefited. Due to victim skepticism of the Criminal Justice System, the Victim Coordinator can lead the victim through the process making them more likely to cooperate in prosecution efforts.

The Victim/Witness Assistance Program will also help victims by educating the public on the rights of victims. This program plans to distribute information to community agencies and groups regarding not only services we can provide but on services available for victims of violence. The Victim Assistance Advisor will be available for speaking engagements to any group/organization in the Tom Green County area. As awareness of the program increases in the community, victims will be better served through the coordinated efforts of various agencies.



Previously when a public entity, such as the County, contracted for service with an outside vendor, there was still an opportunity for local small business to get a portion of the business through subcontract support. However, we are noticing that "all inclusive" or omnibus contracting is becoming more the case, a situation that can effectively cut out local small business from providing smaller contract opportunities or even subcontracting.

is arising that is becoming detrimental to our local businesses' ability to bid on

local service contracts.

While we understand that the size and scope of some service contracts may necessitate using an outside contractor, and while we realize that everyone has the same bidding opportunity, we would like to state the following:

- 1) The Chamber of Commerce commends the Commissioners Court for adopting the local bidder preference policy (allowing for a local bid to be accepted if it is within 3% of the lowest bid). This approach gives one more chance for our local tax and contribution dollars to stay in San Angelo.
- 2) When contracting for products or services, please ask if by accepting the bid whether it would involve the loss of an existing contract with a local vender. For instance, if the contract is for food service, does it also cover beverages and/or paper products (which could be provided locally) or will the company be providing all products through their own suppliers? If a local vender will lose its existing contract by the County accepting the new contract, were current service providers notified of the potential scope of the bid and did they bid on the product or service?

- 3) Sometimes the public governing body accepting the contract may not be aware of the loss of local vender support. When awarding a contract that will result in the loss of local business support, we encourage that situation to be publicly acknowledged in the bid acceptance process.
- 4) Finally, we urge the Commissioners Court to discourage the use of allinclusive, sweeping omnibus bid specifications when contracting for services. The scope of these contracts may appear easier to handle, but they often result in smaller businesses being unable to compete and even losing existing contracts that they were unaware would be affected by the contract.

These statements are intended to provide a point of discussion, and we are certainly aware that state purchasing rules may require or prohibit certain wording or approaches in the bid process. However, we are requesting your consideration of our local business community and START your search for goods and services locally because Shopping Today Adds Resources Tomorrow. Please keep in mind the value of keeping dollars circulating in San Angelo and growing our local employment and tax base.




