The Commissioners' Court of Tom Green County, Texas, met in Regular Session July 10, 2001, in the Edd B. Keyes Building, with the following members present:

- E. Acknowledged the waterline crossing 4th Road that was installed by Elmer Edgington as a matter of record and exhibit recorded with these minutes.
- F. Accepted the completion of the 2001 Tom Green County Fixed Asset Inventory as reported by Johnny Grimaldo, Purchasing Agent.

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Herb Straach – Templeton Construction---reported that the work on phase II was moving along well with the drywalls going in, electricians, plumbers and duct work moving ahead.

Lane Weathermart replaced the air conditioning unit on the roof last week. Rust Damage was found in the I beam of a primary pillar and an engineer needs to check out the extend of the damage on the steel beams of the building. He presented bids from John Tonne Welding of San Angelo, J & T Welding of San Angelo, and Construction Services of Christoval. (Bids recorded with these minutes)

Judge Brown moved to award the bid to Construction Services of Christoval for investigation of water damaged columns of Phase II and to be repaired upon the approval by the Court. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Gary McClure – Templeton Construction- requested an additional \$100,000.00 in the Contingency fund for change orders on several small projects to be done in Phase II & III.

Judge Brown moved to increase the Contingency fund an additional \$100,000.00 to come out of projected available jail funds to complete small projects in Phase II & III. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor of the motion.

Johnny Grimaldo—Purchasing Agent --- presented the bids from the two lowest vendors, Jim Bass Ford & Mitchell Buick-Pontiac-GMC for one or more new model mid-sized vehicle for the CSCD as proposed in RFB 01-023. Arnold Patrick, representing CSCD, requested that the Court go with the higher bid for the Ford Taurus based on the Consumer's buying guide report that showed more repairs on the Grand Am. (Recorded with these minutes.)

Commissioner Friend moved to award the RFB 01-023 bid to Mitchell Buick-Pontiac-GMC for 3 Grand Am's at a price of \$51,614.25. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor.

Judge Brown moved to adopt the Proclamation proclaiming July 15 –21, 2001 as "Probation, Parole & Community Supervision Officer's Week". Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor.

A.J. Jones and Fred Campbell requested that Tom Green County join in with other counties located on the Concho River in initiating a Water Master Program for the Concho River Basin Water Conservancy Association. According to Mr. Campbell there are more permits issued for water than actually flows down the Concho and there is a definite need for a conservative water plan due to improper management through the years. Irrigation would be metered and regulated, but the household usage would be allowed without flow regulations. TNRCC would be the regulating body.

Winn Brown of Christoval asked the question about the cost to obtain water. The initial idea is to charge a fee of \$50.00 plus \$1.00 per acre foot based on their state permit.

James Roach spoke on behalf of Dove Creek and Spring Creek where some of these same problems exist. Trees are dying and the water table is low.

No action was taken by the Court.

Keith Davis---Attorney for the County---- addressed the Court regarding a settlement of a claim asserted by National Union Fire Insurance Company.

Judge Brown moved to pay \$848.08 plus the court cost to settle the case with National Union Fire Insurance Company. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor.

Judge Brown moved to raise the cost of the Development Permits to:

- \$ 210.00 -- Septic tank permits for single member dwellings
- \$ 410.00 ----Septic tank permits for all other types
- \$ 150.00-----Permits for food service establishments
- \$ 50.00 ---- each flood plain development

to be effective October 1, 2001. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Friend and all voted in favor.

There were no Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development issues to be discussed.

On State Highway 380 east of Veribest, Texas beginning on Tom Green County 4th Road.


From north edge of pavement on HWY 380 go north and west on 4th Road 5,699 feet.

The water line is 1 1/4 inch PVC plastic pipe encased in 3" metal pipe covering the entire right of way from fence to fence.



Dear Sir:

Rust has been observed in steel column sections at the first and second floor levels of the referenced building. The appearance of rust at connections and in column sections indicates that water has been allowed to pond against the steel for a prolonged period of time. The degree of deterioration varies in the elements that we have observed to date.

I would propose the following steps be taken:

- 1. Remove plaster and masonry around columns to expose steel members and connections.
- 2. Remove concrete fill and concrete pedestals to expose steel at floor levels.
- 3. Observe and record incidents of deterioration.
- 4. Determine corrective measures necessary to restore structural capacities.

Determinations of corrective measures will have to be made on an individual incident basis as the deterioration appears vary from area to area.
