Judge Brown called the meeting to order at 9:34 AM

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Commissioner Easingwood gave the invocation.

Commissioner Weeks moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented:

- B. Acknowledge Proclamation in support of the "Recognition Day for the Concho Valley Retired and Senior Volunteers" and the Year 2001 as the "International Year of Volunteers."
- C. Approve the proposed changes of Constable fees in Precinct 1,2,3 and 4 for 2002. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- D. Approve Bulk Vending Policy as presented. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- E. Accepted the July 2001 Solid Waste Report as a matter of record. (Recorded with these minutes)
- F. Approve the Agreement with Alfonse H. Schwartz to supply water and caliche for the construction and the repair of county roads. (Recorded with these minutes.)

Motion was seconded by Judge Brown.

There was some discussion on the salary paid to the newly acquired employees that will continue to staff the Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Center and the funding for this new acquisition.

All voted in favor of approving the Consent Agenda as presented.

Delores Schwertner was present to explain about the Volunteer Program for Seniors, 55 and above. She also explained the importance of not only the Senior Volunteers, but volunteers of all ages throughout the state.

Judge Brown moved to approve the Proclamation proclaiming September 14, 2001 as "Recognition Day for the Concho Valley Retired and Senior Volunteers" and the year 2001 as the "International Year of Volunteers". Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)

Judge Brown moved to rescind the Countywide Burn Ban. Commissioner Bookter seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Easingwood explained to the rest of the Court that he had received several phone calls, after the Court meeting, last week requesting to be allowed to take flood damaged materials to the dump. He authorized the opening of the Christoval collection site on Saturday, September 1, 2001 for disposals. Collections were not made at that time and Commissioner Easingwood offered to reimburse the County for the cost in order to help the Christoval community with their damage.

Judge Brown moved to waive the collection fees for the residents of the Christoval area due to the recent flood damage, in order to dispose of the damaged materials and extra debris for Saturday, September 1 and 8, 2001 at the Christoval collection site. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Johnny Grimaldo, Purchasing Agent, explained to the Court that only 1 bid had received for the 903 N. Martin Luther King property and the bid received was lower than the minimum requested bid.

Commissioner Weeks moved to accept the bid of \$1,000.00 submitted by the Northwest Lions Club for the RFB 01-025 sale of real property located at 903 N. Martin Luther King, former Dunbar Library. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor.

Judge Brown moved to pass on installing a new phone line in the County Clerk's office in order to try to utilize the existing fax line for the credit card system. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Judge Brown moved to establish the rate for priority service, to issue birth or death certificates, at the established fee for credit cards or debit cards added to the current rate for customer preference of delivery (express or priority mail) along with the current state rate for the actual certificate(s) by the County Clerk's office. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Stewart Dickson, Sheriff's office, explained that they had been approved for a \$28,158.00 Grant that they are proposing to use for the upgrade of the radios and towers to improve the communication with the officers without the radio gaps. There is a 10% County match in order to obtain the grant. The cost of the necessary repairs will be an estimated \$49,000.00, but he felt they would be able to secure the balance of the funding.

Judge Brown moved to ratify the recommendation for the expense from the Criminal Justice Block Grant to proceed with the upgrades on the communication equipment, radios and towers. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Anne Bramble explained that the Federal Government requires that all prisoners have access to West Law in the Prison law library and the computer being transferred would be for that purpose.

Judge Brown moved to approve the transfer of an in stock computer from the Information Technology Department to the Jail Law Library, for the purpose of upgrading, in order to have access to West Law as required by the Federal Government and this would be the only internet access available. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor.

Judge Brown moved to approve the auto allowance for Richard Valles, Housekeeping Supervisor, effective 7-1-01 through 9-30-01. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor.

There was some discussion as to the type of penalty to be imposed for not filing replats as required by the Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations. County Attorney, Chris Taylor, was instructed by the Court to take the necessary action as stated in

232.005 regarding the filings against individuals who are in violation of the Subdivision Regulations.

Mike Loving, County Health Officer, advised the Court that there is no County regulations against a cement batch processing plant as long as the company is not in violation of environmental standards as set forth by the TNRCC or unless there is a subdivision restriction.

There were no line item transfers.

§ 232.005. Enforcement in General; Penalty

(a) At the request of the commissioners court, the county attorney or other prosecuting attorney for the county may file an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to: 72

COUNTY REGULATORY AUTHORITY Ch. 232

§ 232.005

- (1) enjoin the violation or threatened violation of a requirement established by, or adopted by the commissioners court under a preceding section of this chapter; or
- (2) recover damages in an amount adequate for the county to undertake any construction or other activity necessary to bring about compliance with a requirement established by, or adopted by the commissioners court under a preceding section of this chapter.
- (b) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a requirement established by, or adopted by the commissioners court under a preceding section of this chapter. An offense under this subsection is a Class B misdemeanor. This subsection does not apply to a violation for which a criminal penalty is prescribed by Section 232.0048.
- (c) A requirement that was established by or adopted under Chapter 436, Acts of the 55th Legislature, Regular Session, 1957 (Article 6626a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), or Chapter 151, Acts of the 52nd Legislature, Regular Session, 1951 (Article 2372k, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), before September 1,1983, and that, after that date, continues to apply to a subdivision of land is enforceable under Subsection (a). A knowing or intentional violation of the requirement is an offense under Subsection (b).


