County Judge, Mike Brown, called the meeting to order at 8:45 AM

Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bookter and all voted in favor.

Herb Straach, Templeton Construction, reported to the Court all items, on the list, have been taken care of at the Roy K. Robb Center, except for the things maintenance was to handle. He also reported that after the last rain, four more leaks were discovered and they are checking on the source. In Phase II, Intertel is working on the intercom. The Fire Marshall will do his inspection on Thursday or Friday of this week. Inspection, by the Jail Commission, is scheduled for December 3, 2001. The inmate painting crew will start painting the grills in the exercise yard as soon as they finish where they are painting now. In Phase III, the demolition will be finished after all the prisoners are transferred. Electrical and drywalls continue. Millwork to be done in

Courtrooms, there is still some plastering and brickwork to be done after the demolition is completed.

Judge Brown moved to confirm, adopt and ratify contracts for the Roy K. Rob Post Adjudication Facility for Residential Services, with the following Counties: El Paso, Comal, Concho, Runnels, Schliecher, Irion, Coke, Sterling, Anderson, Bexar, Brazos, Lubbock, Tarrant, Hayes, Williamson, Ector, Randall, & Fayette and authorize Judge Brown to execute future contracts for residential services with the Roy K. Robb Facility. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Weeks and all voted in favor.

Item #6 There was some discussion regarding the alternate sources of disposing of solid waste since the collection fees continue to be a deficit amount. **No action taken.**

Bob Post made a presentation pertaining to the Aldridge Subdivision and asked that a variance be granted since this house and road had been in place in excess of 20 years. He further explained that the subdivision was being set out for only this one house and one piece of property in order to settle an estate and not for developmental purposes.

Commissioner Bookter moved to accept the Aldridge Subdivision and grant a variance from the engineer's water study, the drainage and the paved road. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

Commissioner Bookter moved to accept the Treasurer's report for the month of October 2001, as presented. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor. Commissioner Weeks moved to approve the installation of a telephone in the Courthouse basement conference room for use by the outside auditors for the duration of the time in which they are doing their field work (March) for the County, to be paid for out of non departmental line item. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

Item #9 Regarding Grape Creek Village Subdivision was tabled.

Judge Brown moved for the approval of a Resolution to participate with the City of San Angelo in the Criminal Justice Division grant application for funds for placement of an Assistant District Attorney with the Rio Concho Multi-Agency Drug Enforcement Task Force; Execution of an Interlocal Agreement between the City of San Angelo and Tom Green County for that position; and the execution of a Local employment program certification document. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

Joe Lane, Information Technology, complimented the staff and how they had made his beginnings (11-14-01) much easier. He reported that the JP #2 site had gone down on Monday, so they had spent the day getting it back up and on line. Software group was installing new scanner for the County Clerk's office. He was getting a price quote for a new fax in the Sheriff's office. He will continue to work on special project, as budgeted, to replace older computers.

Judge Brown moved to approve the purchase of 3 viewing stations for the County Clerk's office at a cost of \$3,048.00 to be paid out of Record preservation money. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

The Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations will be updated and a copy of TNRCC Section 232 will be attached. The intent of the Court is to protect the best interest of the public.

There were no line item transfers.

As per the attached page of Tom Green County's Investment Policy for the period of January 1, 2001 to September 30, 2001 I submit the 2001 Annual Security Report.

The County maintained a passive investment portfolio. My priority as Investment Officer is to maintain Safety, Liquidity, Diversification, Yield, and Maturity. In doing so all monies with the exception of Two (2) Securities were kept in MBIA and Funds Management. This allowed the County to earn the highest yield possible while having daily liquidity availability. In accordance to Safety MBIA pledges 102% collateral as well as a letter of credit from their bank to assure our Principal safety. MBIA post interest daily, therefore today's interest becomes tomorrow's principal. Tom Green County owns shares in Funds Management investment portfolio, which is backed by the US Government.

Tom Green County owned "FNMA Callable Cusip 3134GH28 matures 04/19/04 Broker Morgan Keegan General Fund", until 04/20/01 at which time this security was called. The remaining security <u>owned "US Treasury Cusip 9128275A6C matures 04/27/04 Broker Prudential General Fund" will</u> be held until maturity unless otherwise directed by the Commissioners' Court in a regular meeting and documented in the Courts' Minutes. For more detailed information on these securities please refer to the Treasurer's Monthly Reports.

In the past all funds were transferred out of Texas State Bank into MBIA or Funds Management to maximize our interest earnings. However, with the current state of rates, my philosophy will change somewhat. I will be leaving a larger portion in the checking accounts to take advantage of the Depository Bid contract, which guarantees a 3.75% interest rate. I will be weighing the amount carefully as the down side of leaving our money in the checking will cost more in Service charges. I will also maintain my Diversification strategy according to the PFIA.

In closing, I submit the FY01 Annual Report for your review and acceptance.

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#### AGREEMENT FOR PLACEMENT AND TREATMENT OF ADJUDICATED OFFENDERS

This Contract is entered into on the <u>1st</u> day of, <u>September</u>, 200<u>1</u>, by and between Tom Green County and Tom Green County Juvenile Board ("Service Provider"), and

51st Judicial District which includes the following counties: Schliecher, Irion, Coke and Sterling_Counties("County"), having administrative offices at :

#### 1253 W 19th Street, San Angelo, Texas (Address)

By this Agreement, and in consideration of the mutual promises set forth below; and,

WHEREAS Tom Green County owns the Facility; and

WHEREAS Tom Green County Juvenile Board operates the Facility; and

WHEREAS <u>51st Judicial District</u>, acting by and through its Juvenile Board, in order (Name of County)

to carry out and conduct its juvenile program in accordance with the Juvenile Justice Code, has need of the use of the Service Provider to house and treat court-ordered children of juvenile age, referred to the County Juvenile Department for an act of delinquent conduct, an act indicating a need of supervision, and a need for substance abuse treatment, and;

WHEREAS, Tom Green County and the Tom Green County Juvenile Board will make the Facility available to 51st Judicial District Juvenile Board for such use and purpose, and the County Juvenile Board desires to contract for the use of said facility under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Term. The Term of this Contract shall commence on the <u>1st</u> day of <u>September</u>, 2001 and shall continue through the <u>31st</u> day of <u>August</u>, 200_2.
- 2. Provision of Services. Service Provider agrees to provide the following services, which shall be limited to male adjudicated offenders in need of residential services in certified facilities meeting applicable standards. Service Provider shall operate the Facility in compliance with the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission Standards for Post Adjudication Facilities. Service Provider shall comply with all state and federal applicable licensing and/or certification requirements, including but not limited to licensing by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse ("TCADA").
  - 2.1 Service Provider shall operate the Facility in compliance with the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission Standards for Post Adjudication Facilities. Service Provider shall comply with all state and federal

Agreement for Services - 1 applicable licensing and/or certification requirements, including but not limited to licensing by the Texas Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse ("TCADA").

- **2.2** Service Provider shall provide individual or family chemical dependency counseling.
- **2.3** Service Provider shall allow County to perform monitoring, performance evaluations, investigations, or audits.
  - 2.3.1 Service Provider shall provide access to, and inspection and reproduction of, all records related to services rendered under this Contract which are necessary to facilitate monitoring, performance evaluations, investigations or audits.
  - 2.3.2 Records include, but are not limited to contracts, note, real property documents, accounting/financial records, written policies and procedures, correspondence, performance evaluation date and reports, and any other information pertinent to revenues, costs, expenses and performance of services provided under this Contract belonging to Service Provider.
- 2.4 Service Provider shall maintain all financial records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles promulgated by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Further, Service Provider shall maintain and retain records for a minimum of three (3) years and ninety (90) calendar days after the termination of the contract period, or for three (3) years after the end of the federal fiscal year in which services were provided, whichever is longer. If any litigation, claims, disputes, or audit involving these records begins before the three (3) year and Ninety (90) calendar day period expires, Service Provider will keep the records an documents until all litigation, claims, disputes or audit findings are resolved. Resolution is when a final order is issued in litigation, or a written agreement is entered into between County and Service Provider.
- 2.5 Individualized Treatment Plan ("ITP")
  - 2.5.1 Each juvenile placed with Service Provider shall have a written Individualized Treatment Plan ("ITP"), developed in concert with the juvenile and mutually agreed upon by the appropriate Service Provider staff and appropriate County personnel within seventytwo (72) hours of the date of placement. Service Provider shall identify goals and outputs, and shall document measurable outcomes which relate to program objectives.
  - 2.5.2 Service Provider shall hold a monthly ITP review and notify the parents or legal guardian of the juvenile and representative of the County five (5) business days' in advance of the review. The progress review documents the youth's progress in the program.
- 2.6 Service Provider shall provide, within the limits of state and federal law, accesses to a free and appropriate public education and related services through the local public school district, and when appropriate, provide vocational program available through the Service Provider program.

- 2.7 Service Provider shall provide transportation in a well-maintained vehicle suitable for purposes of this agreement, for the referred juvenile to work site(s) until either public or private transportation is deemed appropriate by Service Provider and County.
- 2.8 Service Provider shall ensure that suspected or alleged cases of child abuse are immediately reported to the County Placement Officer, and the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission.
- 2.9 Service Provider shall ensure that all paid, volunteer and intern staff are trained to properly identify child physical, emotional, sexual abuse and neglect and to follow the appropriate reporting procedures to the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services' Abuse and Neglect Hotline 1-800-252-5400 or fax the information to 1-800-832-2090.
- 2.10 If a referred juvenile in placement with Service Provider makes an unauthorized departure, becomes seriously ill, or is involved in an accident of a serious nature, Contractor shall notify the juvenile's Probation Officer and the County Placement Officer immediately and ensure that the parent(s) and proper authorities are notified.
- 2.11 Eligibility to Receive Payment on State Contracts. Under Texas Family code §231.006, Service Provider certifies that the individual or business entity named in this agreement is not ineligible to receive the specified grant, loan or payment and acknowledges that this agreement may be terminated and payment may be withheld if this certificate is inaccurate.
- 2.12 Recognizing that part of a juvenile's program may include time away from the Facility, such as weekends, holidays, etc., and that the Service Provider must retain space for this juvenile until his return, County will pay Service Provider the agreed upon amount for such regularly scheduled days away from the Facility, providing it does not exceed ten (10) days at any one time.
- **2.13** Service Provider is under no obligation to retain space for the client in unauthorized departure situations.

#### 3. Placement.

- 3.1 County shall transport the child to the Facility. Prior to transporting a child to the Facility for placement, the County shall call the Facility to insure that space is available. Placement of children from County may be denied if there is no available space, as determined by the Facility Administrator, acting in his/her sole discretion.
- 3.2 Placement of any juvenile in the Facility shall be conditioned upon a proper order of the Juvenile Court of the County. The Facility Administrator shall be furnished a copy of said order with twenty-four (24) hours or one working day of the child's admission to the Facility.

#### Agreement for Services - 3

- **3.3** Each child placed at the Facility shall be required to follow the rules and regulations of the Facility as fixed and determined by the Administrator and his/her staff.
- 3.4 If any child accepted from County is found to be, in the sole judgment of the Facility Administrator, actively psychotic, needing detoxification services, unmanageable, or whose mental or physical health condition might endanger the other occupants of the Facility, the Facility Administrator shall notify County that said juvenile shall be immediately removed from the Facility.
- **3.5** Subject to the foregoing, Service Provider agrees to accept for placement any child qualified hereunder without regard to such child's religion, race, creed, color, or national origin.
- 3.6 County shall provide Service Provider the names of all persons authorized by County to visit children placed in the Facility. Visitors must be jointly approved by the child's caseworker and the Facility Administrator.
- 3.7 County shall provide a copy of child's medical, psychological, and dental evaluation that has been completed in the last 60 days before or at the time of admission process but no later than twenty-four (24) hours after admission. Further, the Facility Administrator shall be informed of all Court dates and times, if possible, so that appropriate arrangements can be made for the child's appearance at same.
- 3.8 It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that children placed in the facility under a proper order of the Juvenile Court of the County shall be maintained thereto except that the staff of the contracting jurisdiction may take the children under supervision from the Facility to court hearings, counseling sessions, medical/dental appointments or other places as determined by County. The staff of the County will be required to give adequate notice of the child's departure, expected time of return, and shall sign a temporary release form to be provided y Service Provider.
- 3.9 It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that children placed in the Facility shall be removed from the Facility by the County, its agents, servants, or employees at the expiration of the court order under which the child is being detained unless a new order/waiver has been issued authorizing the continued placement. A copy of the order or waiver shall be furnished to the facility as stated in paragraph 3.2 herein.
- 3.10 It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that children placed in the Facility shall not be removed prior to the expiration of the court order except by a probation officer of the County.
- **3.11** Service Provider is under no obligation to accept a referred juvenile who is deemed inappropriate for placement in the program by Service Provider.
- 4. Payment. For and in consideration of the above-mentioned services, County agrees to pay service Provider the sum of One Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$100.00) per client, per day. This fee does not exceed the actual cost of care of the Service Provider, which is One Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$100.00) per day, and does not exceed the amount allowed in the current CJD Maximum Rate Schedule.
  - **4.1** Payment is to be made monthly. Claim for payment will be submitted no later than ten days from the last day of the month for which payment is being requested.
  - **4.2** Each billing shall contain the name of the client or clients for whom payment is being requested along with the number of days (stated consecutively) for which payment is requested.
  - **4.3** A child placed in the Facility before midnight on any one day will be considered under this Contract as having been in custody the entire day for billing purposes.
  - **4.4** Payment shall be made to Tom Green County, 1253 W. 19th, San Angelo, Texas, 76903, within twenty (20) days of receipt of billing.
  - **4.5** Service Provider shall account separately for the receipt and expenditure of any and all funds received under this contract.
- 5. Emergency Medical Services. If, in the sole discretion of Service Provider, there is a need for emergency examination, treatment, and/or hospitalization for a juvenile placed in the Facility by County, Service Provider is authorized to secure such examination, treatment or hospitalization at County's expense and to request that County be billed for the same.
  - 5.1 Service Provider or its representative shall be responsible for transporting the child to receive medical services in case of an emergency.
  - **5.2** Any and all medical/psychiatric treatment required to meet the needs of the child shall be the sole responsibility of said child's parent(s), guardian or court ordered appointed conservator, by either personal payment, health insurance or Medicaid coverage, as well as clothing, or other expenses not provided for in Service Provider Program. However in no case shall a child be denied any needed medical/psychiatric treatment or clothing due to the inability to pay. In the event the child's family is unable to pay, County agrees to pay for said services and to indemnify and hold harmless Service Provider, Tom Green County, Tom Green County Juvenile Probation Department and Tom Green County Juvenile Board, its representatives, agents, elected officials and employees, for any liability for charges for medical treatment, examination, and/or hospitalization.
  - **5.3** Service Provider shall notify County of such emergency treatment as soon as is reasonable practicable.
  - 5.4 Under no circumstances shall Service Provider pay for, be responsible for, or be liable for any emergency examination, treatment, or hospitalization outside the Facility.

- 6. Breaches, Notice and Cure. In the event of a breach or any obligation or covenant under this Contract, the non-breaching party may give the breaching party written notice specifically identifying the breach, and the breaching party shall have twenty (20) days in which to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within such period, or if good faith efforts to cure the breach have not been undertaken within such period, the breaching party shall be in default, and the non-breaching party shall be entitled to pursue any remedies it may have by reason of the breach, including termination of this Contract. The waiver of a breach of any provision of this Contract shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other breach.
- 7. Termination. Either party may terminate this Contract, with or without cause, by providing thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party of said termination by certified mail or personal delivery to the address given herein. Thirty (30) days after receipt of notice to terminate by either party, this Contract shall terminate, become null and void and be of no further force and effect. On or before the termination date, County shall remove all children from their jurisdiction currently in the facility.

- 11. Partial Invalidity. If any term, covenant, condition, or provision of this Contract is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated thereby.
- **12.** Integration, Entire Agreement, Amendment. This is the entire, integrated Contract between the parties. There are no representation, covenants, warranties, promises, agreements, conditions or undertakings, oral or written,

between the parties other than herein set forth. This Contract supersedes all oral agreements and negotiations and all writings not herein referred to and incorporated. No subsequent alteration, amendment, change or addition to this contract shall be binding upon the parties unless made in writing, signed by both parties, or their successors.

  - 5.4 Under no circumstances shall Service Provider pay for, be responsible for, or be liable for any emergency examination, treatment, or hospitalization outside the Facility.

- 6. Breaches, Notice and Cure. In the event of a breach or any obligation or covenant under this Contract, the non-breaching party may give the breaching party written notice specifically identifying the breach, and the breaching party shall have twenty (20) days in which to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within such period, or if good faith efforts to cure the breach have not been undertaken within such period, the breaching party shall be in default, and the non-breaching party shall be entitled to pursue any remedies it may have by reason of the breach, including termination of this Contract. The waiver of a breach of any provision of this Contract shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other breach.
- 7. Termination. Either party may terminate this Contract, with or without cause, by providing thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party of said termination by certified mail or personal delivery to the address given herein. Thirty (30) days after receipt of notice to terminate by either party, this Contract shall terminate, become null and void and be of no further force and effect. On or before the termination date, County shall remove all children from their jurisdiction currently in the facility.
- 8. Independent Contractor Relationship. Nothing in this Contract shall constitute or be construed to create a partnership, joint venture or employeremployee relationship between Service Provider and County. Service Provider and County shall at all times be independent contractors.
- 9. Default. In the event of default on the part of Service Provider, County may cancel or suspend the contract. In this event, Service Provider shall be entitled to recovery for all services provided or materials delivered prior to the cancellation date or unused materials delivered prior to the cancellation date (or unused materials may be returned) or shall repay any funds advanced for services not yet rendered.
- 10. Governing Law And Forum. This Agreement and its interpretation and any disputes relating thereto, arising out of or connected with this Agreement, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to its conflicts of law provisions. Any dispute relating to, arising out of, or connected with this Agreement shall be filed and maintained in San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas, in the State Courts located in San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas. This Agreement shall be performed in Tom Green County, Texas.
- **11. Partial Invalidity.** If any term, covenant, condition, or provision of this Contract is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated thereby.
- **12.** Integration, Entire Agreement, Amendment. This is the entire, integrated Contract between the parties. There are no representation, covenants, warranties, promises, agreements, conditions or undertakings, oral or written,

In accordance with the provisions set forth herein, the County of El Paso and Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Facility, a Tom Green County Post Adjudication Facility, d/b/a Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Facility, hereinafter called Service Agency, agree as follows:

#### I. PROVISION OF SERVICES

The Service Agency shall provide the following professional services, for children placed for services by the El Paso County Juvenile Probation Department:

- A. The Service Agency shall provide necessary residential services including, but not limited to, food, shelter, clothing and supervision;
- B. The Service Agency shall provide necessary counseling services including, but not limited to, individual, group and family/parental involvement;
- C. The Service Agency shall provide within the limits of state and federal law, access to a free appropriate public education and related services through the local public school district.
- D. The Service Agency is under no obligation to accept a client who is deemed inappropriate for placement in the program by the Service Agency.
- E. Each Client placed with the Service Agency shall have a written Child/Family Service Plan (CFSP), developed in concert with the client and mutually agreed upon by the appropriate Service Agency Staff and Supervising Juvenile Probation Officer personnel prior to placement, identifying how the nine (9) domains pertains to the child.
- F. The CFSP shall be reviewed jointly by the appropriate Service Agency staff, the child and the Supervising Juvenile Probation Officer personnel at reasonable intervals, not to exceed ninety (90) days, to assess the client's progress with modification of the CFSP being made when indicated.
  - 1. Service Agency shall complete the Review of Child/Family Service Plan (Exhibit A) and forward it to the Supervising Juvenile Probation Officer every ninety (90) days. Failure to comply with this provision will result in withholding payment.
  - 2. The child's progress shall be assessed on each identified goal(s) pertaining to the child within the nine (9) domains listed in Exhibit A.

- 3. <u>Outcome Measurement:</u> Service Agency warrants improvement in fifty percent (50%) or more of the identified goal(s) pertaining to the child, as measured by a positive rating (+1, +2, +3) on a six (6) point scale: (-2, -1, 0, +1, +2, +3) during the ninety (90) day monitoring period. To be measured as follows:
  - (A) +3 Goal achieved and maintained
  - (B) +2 Substantial improvement in behavior identified in the goal
  - (C) +1 Some improvement in behavior identified in the goal
  - (D) 0 No decline or improvement in behavior identified in the goal
  - (E) -1 Some worsening in behavior identified in the goal
  - (F) -2 Substantial worsening in behavior identified in the goal

#### As per 1 TAC § 351.13(e)(1)

- 4. The Service Agency shall provide each child's Probation Officer with a written report of the child's progress on a monthly basis (Exhibit B). *Failure to comply with this provision will result in withholding of payment.
- G. The CFSP shall contain the reasons why the placement will benefit the client and specify behavior goals and objectives as they pertain to the nine (9) domains being sought for each client. Included shall be how the goals and objectives are to be achieved in the Service Agency placement.
- H. Copies of the original CFSP and the periodic reviews are to be maintained by the Service Agency and the County Placement Officer.
- I. The Service Agency shall ensure that, before a child is permitted to participate in furlough, home visit, or extended agency trip, a court order has been obtain from the 327th Judicial District Court approving the child's absence for the appropriate length of time.
- J. The Service Agency shall ensure that unless otherwise stipulated by the County, the child may visit freely with parent(s) and relatives at the home in accordance with established Service Agency policies.
- K. The Service Agency shall ensure that suspected or alleged cases of child abuse or neglect are immediately reported to the Program Specialist, the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services Abuse and Neglect Hotline 1-800-252-5400 or fax the information to 1-800-832-2090.

The Service Agency will also ensure that all of their paid, volunteer and intern staff are trained to properly identify child physical, emotional, sexual abuse and neglect and to follow the appropriate reporting procedures to the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, Abuse and Neglect Hotline 1-800-252-5400 or fax the information to 1-800-832-2090.

- L. If a child in placement at a Service Agency makes an unauthorized departure, becomes seriously ill, is involved in an accident of a serious nature, the Service Agency shall notify the child's Probation Officer and the Program Specialist immediately and ensure that the parents and proper authorities are notified, including the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services, Abuse and Neglect Hotline at 1-800-252-5400 or fax the information to 1-800-832-2090.
- M. The County reserves the right to terminate the child's placement at the Service Agency at its discretion. The Service Agency must not release a child to any person or agency other than the El Paso County Juvenile Probation Department designated Transportation Officer without the express written consent of the County.
- N. Upon successful completion of the program, a Discharge Plan to include but not limited to school records, school withdrawal form and Community Improvement Program hours form, needs to be provided to the supervising probation officer within at least fourteen (14) calendar days prior to the date of successful discharge. Should a juvenile be negatively discharged, a Discharge Plan to include but not limited to school records, school withdrawal form and Community Improvement Program hours form, must accompany the juvenile at the time of transport to the El Paso County Juvenile Detention Center. Failure to comply with this provision will result in withholding of payment.
- O. If the juvenile is currently prescribed medication and is discharged from the facility, the Service Agency will send enough of the medication to cover thirty (30) days or will send a new prescription with the juvenile. Failure to comply with this provision will result in withholding of payment.
- P. Eligibility to Receive Payment on State Contracts.

Under Texas Family Code § 231.006, the Service Agency certifies that the individual or business entity named in this agreement is not ineligible to receive the specified grant, loan or payment and acknowledges that this agreement may be terminated and payment may be withheld if this certificate is inaccurate.

Q. The Service Agency shall account separately for the receipt and expenditure of any and all funds received pursuant to this agreement.

#### II. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

A. For and in consideration of the above mentioned services, the County agrees to pay the Service Agency the following amounts:

\$100.00 per day

B. The Service Agency shall submit an invoice to the County for services on a monthly basis. Each billing shall contain the name of the client or clients for whom payment is being requested and will list the established Level of Care, along with the number of days (stated consecutively) for which payment is requested. Payment of said invoice shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt by the County.

- C. Recognizing that part of a client's rehabilitation program may include time away from the residential setting of the Service Agency such as weekends, holidays, etc., and that the Service Agency must retain space for this client until his return, the County will pay the Service Agency the above agreed upon amount for such regularly scheduled days away from the Service Agency or its program providing they do not exceed ten (10) days at any one time.
- D. The Service Agency is under no obligation to retain space for the client in an unauthorized departure situation. However, in no event shall the County pay for the days when clients were absent without authorization, but no space in the program was retained for such absent client(s) by the Service Agency. The County must be informed in writing if and for how long the Service Agency intends to retain space for such an absent client, and the County may decline in writing all or part of the period for which the Service Agency intends to retain the space.
- E. Service Agency shall complete and submit Medicaid Application upon initial date of placement. Service Agency is responsible for filing Medicaid paperwork within the mandatory/specified time frames. The El Paso County Juvenile Probation Department will not subsidize Medicaid payments.
- F. Prior written authorization by the El Paso County Chief Juvenile Probation Officer, or his designee shall be obtained for any and all dental and medical services provided by the Service Agency. Exception to prior approval is hereby granted if it is medically determined that dental and/or medical services are required due to an emergency involving an immediate danger to the health and safety of the client. Dental and medical services shall be reimbursed by Texas Medicaid for eligible children in eligible settings. Should medical service not meet Medicaid eligibility the County of El Paso upon submission of an invoice for pre-authorized or emergency services, will reimburse the service provider.

#### III. EXAMINATION OF PROGRAM AND RECORDS

- A. The Service Agency agrees that it will permit the County to examine and evaluate its program of services provided under the terms of this contract and to review County client records. The examination and evaluation of the program will include unscheduled site visitations and observations of programs in operation.
- B. The Service Agency shall provide to the County such descriptive information on contracted clients as requested on forms provided by the County.
- C. The Service Agency agrees to maintain and make available for inspection, audit or reproduction, by an authorized representative of El Paso County and the State of Texas; books, documents and other evidence pertaining to the cost and expenses of this contract, hereinafter called Records.
- D. The Service Agency agrees to maintain these Records for three (3) years after final payment or until the state approved audit has been made and all questions therefrom are resolved, whichever is later.

#### IV. FEE ASSESSMENT

- A. Clients or their families shall not be assessed fees for services by the Service agency, unless arrangements are specified by the Court. This does not preclude reasonable attempts to seek voluntary contribution from families or County clients for donations of clothing, personal articles and funds to assist in supporting a youth's rehabilitation.
- B. If a client is eligible for fiscal support from another state/federal agency or organization, the Service Agency shall ensure that the County is not charged for such fiscal support for which the client is otherwise eligible.

#### V. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

- A. Contractor certifies that it will comply fully with the non-discrimination and equal opportunity provisions of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended; the American with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations that implement those laws.
- B. Service Agency agrees that it will not engage in any religious indoctrination or require any of the children placed with the agency under this contract to participate in any religious activity. Service Agency further agrees that it will not impose any sanctions or deny any benefits to any children placed with the agency under this contract solely on account of the child's religious beliefs or because the child does not participate in religious activities. Service Agency further agrees that it will not engage in any activity with respect to the children placed with the agency under this contract that would constitute an establishment of religion or in any manner violate the rights of the children to religious freedom under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution.

#### VI. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. Regardless of date of execution, this agreement shall be effective September 1, 2001 and shall continue until August 31, 2002.
- B. Service Agency may terminate this agreement without cause by giving thirty (30) days written notice to terminate. The County may terminate this agreement without cause by giving thirty (30) days written notice to terminate. The County may terminate this agreement without notice immediately in the event the Contractor fails to comply with any provision of this agreement. Service Agency shall cease to incur costs associated with this agreement upon termination or receipt of written notice to terminate, whichever occurs first.

#### VII. LAW AND VENUE

In any legal action arising under this contract, the laws of Texas shall apply and venue shall be in El Paso County.

#### VIII. INDEMNITY, INSURANCE AND CERTIFICATION

- A. Service Agency shall indemnify and hold harmless, the County, its agents, Officer, employees and public officials, from any and all injury and damage to persons or property caused by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of agency, its agents, employees, patients, clients and invitees, including the negligent supervision of any person residing at or participating at its facility or in any of its programs.
- B. Service Agency shall purchase at its own expense, commercial public liability insurance in a general aggregate limit of not less than \$ 300,000.00 for personal injury and \$ 100,000.00 for property damage. Such policies shall be with an insurance company licensed to do business or admitted on a surplus lines basis in Texas and shall be satisfactory to the County. All of said insurance policies shall be given at least thirty (30) days advanced written notice of any lapse, amendment or cancellation.
- C. Service Agency shall maintain at its own expense, malpractice insurance with a policy limit of not less than \$ 300,000.00. Such policy shall be with an insurance company licensed to do business or admitted on a surplus lines basis in Texas and shall be satisfactory to the County. All of said insurance policies shall name the County as an additional insured and shall provide that the County shall be given at least thirty (30) days advanced written notice of any lapse, amendment or cancellation.
- D. Service Agency warrants that it and its' individual providers are certified, approved or licensed by all Federal, State or local agencies or departments which have jurisdiction to regulate any activity performed in or by a child residential treatment facility. Proof of such certification, approval or license shall be provided to the El Paso County Juvenile Probation Department within ten (10) days of execution of this agreement.

#### IX. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Independent Contractor. Nothing in this contract shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee between the County and the Service Agency. The Service Agency shall be deemed at all times to be an independent contractor.

#### INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into by and between TOM GREEN COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"), and the City of San Angelo, Texas, a municipal corporation situated in Tom Green County, Texas, (hereinafter referred to as "CITY"), pursuant to V.T.C.A., Government Code §791.000 et seq.

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the CITY and the COUNTY have entered into a cooperative working agreement to carry out grant objectives of the Criminal Justice Division of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "C.J.D."); and

WHEREAS, the CITY has been designated the primary grantee to receive and expend C.J.D. Funds; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY has contributed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to the Fund; and WHEREAS, it is necessary that a portion of the C.J.D. grant funds be expended through the COUNTY as subgrantee; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the COUNTY agree to abide by all provisions of the C.J.D. grant contract;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

#### ARTICLE I.

#### <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this Agreement is to allow the COUNTY to hire one Assistant District Attorney whose salary and fringe benefit costs are funded by the C.J.D. grant and to permit the CITY, as grantee, to reimburse the COUNTY for actual personnel related costs in accordance with a mutually agreed upon pay scale and not to exceed the budget attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof for all purposes.

#### ARTICLE II.

#### TERM

The term of this Agreement is to commence on June 1, 2002, and to end May 31, 2003.

#### ARTICLE III.

#### **CONSIDERATION**

As consideration for this agreement, the CITY agrees to reimburse the COUNTY up to a total of \$70,453.00 in eligible personnel costs paid during the term of the agreement and in accordance with the limits of the budget attached hereto. Reimbursements will be made monthly after the COUNTY has provided such written reports and documentation as may be required by the CITY.

#### ARTICLE IV.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

This Agreement may be amended by the mutual agreement of the parties hereto in a writing to be attached to and incorporated into this Agreement.

#### ARTICLE V.

#### LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions herein, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

#### ARTICLE VI.

#### ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or in writing, between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other Agreement, statement,

or promise relating to the subject matter of this Agreement which is not contained herein shall be valid or binding.
