County Judge, Mike Brown, called the meeting to order at 8:44 AM.

- G. Acknowledged purchase of 106 personal computers for the CAT-D Grant, utilizing the Dell state contract.
- H. Approve bonds for Fred Buck, Justice of the Peace Precinct #3 and James E. Smith, Constable for Precinct #3 as a matter of record.
- I. Accepted the Extension Service Monthly Schedule of Travel for September 2003 as a matter of record. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- J. Set November 20, 2003 as opening date for RFP 04-003 "Workers' Compensation Coverage".
- K. Set November 7, 2003 as opening date for:
 - 1. RFB 04-005 "State Grade & Rock Base."
 - 2. RFB 04-006 "Limestone Type D Mix".

All voted in favor of the motion.

- 5. Becky Harris, Director, reported that there are currently 26 residents at the Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Center. They have referrals coming from Dawson, Lubbock, and Wilbarger. She stated that this was the first time they have had a referral from Wilbarger County. No action was taken. (Report recorded with these minutes.)
- **6.** Deborah Michalewitz addressed the Court on behalf of the Water Valley Volunteer Fire Department, about using the small building, in Harper Park, as a Spook House, with the proceeds going toward a fundraiser to benefit the fire department. She stated that they have all the proper insurance.

Commissioner Weeks moved to waive the rental fees for the small building in Harper Park, and approve the Water Valley Volunteer Fire Department's Spook House Fund Raiser for October 28th, 29th, 30th and 31st, 2003. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

- 7. The Request by the Concho Valley Community Action Agency regarding the utilization of the Bradford Building was **Tabled.**
- 8. Commissioner Easingwood moved to approve the conveyance of 12,012 square feet out of Tract 88 to be conveyed by metes and bounds description into Tract 87, Section Two, Oak Mountain Estates, Tom Green County pursuant to Local Government Code 232.010. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- Commissioner Easingwood moved to adopt a Resolution whereas Tom Green County nominates 1.) Dick Burnett, 2.) A.H. "Chico" Denis, III, 3.) Louis P. Gomez, 4.) Walter W. Pfluger, and 5.) John D. (Douglas) Phillips as candidates for election to the Tom Green County Appraisal District for the term of January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2005. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)

- 10. Judge Brown moved to authorize the County Judge to sign the necessary documents dealing with the oil, gas and mineral working interest in the Trollinger Estate and acknowledgment of such documents entered into the Court Minutes through the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 11. Commissioner Friend moved for the reappointment of William Collins, Dennis Grafa, Joel Sugg and Sylvan Polunsky for a two year term to expire September 30, 2005; appoint Cindy McCammon to replace Jan Cummings for a two year term expiring September 30,2005 and appoint Mark Thieman to replace Caroline O'Connor for the remainder of her term which will expire September 30, 2004, based upon the recommendations of the Library Board. Commissioner Bookter seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- **12.** The appointment of a County Agent for Tom Green County was tabled and will be placed on the October 28, 2003 agenda.
- 13. John Begnaud, County Horticulturalist, explained to the Court that with the assistance of some of the Master Gardeners and some prison inmates, 5 trees were planted October 13th, 2003 and following the announcements after today's meeting, the Court would recess and plant 2 more trees in the front of the Courthouse as part of the reforestation and landscaping of the County grounds. He explained that this is all part of the master plan to replace trees that were destroyed in the 1995 storm and from drought conditions that had created additional losses of trees and shrubs. The money for the purchase of the trees has been accomplished through donations given in memory or honor of someone. The replacement trees and landscaping will be more drought resistant and water conservative. Landscaping efforts will continue in the spring based upon the amount of donations received. Donations can be made through the County Judge's office, the Commissioners or through the Extension Office.
- 14. Judge Brown moved to adopt the Proclamation proclaiming the week of October 19th-25th, 2003 as "National Business Women's Week".

 Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

 (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 15. Judge Brown moved to adopt the Memorandum of Understanding, dated October 1, 2003, between the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and Tom Green County and Amendment #5 of Food Services Contract with Tom Green County Detention Facility and ARAMARK effective October 1, 2003. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion. Judge Brown explained that some of the wording was changed. All voted in favor of the motion. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- **16.** The Treasurer's Monthly report was accepted at the September 30,2003 meeting.
- 17. Judge Brown moved to deny the request for waiver of penalty & interest for TGCAD Account #38-01954-0022-000-00 Teresa Grothe-Netz pursuant to the letter from the Court's Attorney. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 18. Commissioner Weeks moved to approve the purchase of a Brush hog commercial zero turn riding mower by the Parks Department.

 Commissioner Friend seconded the motion. Commissioners Friend and Weeks voted in favor of the motion. Commissioners Bookter and Easingwood voted in opposition. Judge Brown suggested that complete bids be brought before the Court and based on this request Judge Brown voted in opposition. The motion failed 3 to 2.
- **19. No Action taken** on the request from LCRA Transmission Services Corporation and AEP regarding the Midway Cemetery area. Request withdrawn.
- 20. Commissioner Easingwood moved to approve the job description as presented for the Jail as Medical Assistant I at a salary of \$12.00 per hour and Medical Assistant II at a salary of \$9.00 per hour. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)

- 21. Commissioner Easingwood moved to award RFB 03-018 "Firearms" to Jerry Gibbs in the amount of \$392.00. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 22. Commissioner Weeks moved to renew RFP 02-015 "Cellular Service" with West Central Wireless for one additional year. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 23. Commissioner Easingwood moved to accept Collections Analysis Report from Justice of the Peace Precinct #1 for the month of September as presented, and <u>filed</u> in the County Clerk's office for review.

 Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

 (Not recorded with these minutes.)
- 24. Judge Brown announced that the resignation Roy Box, Constable for Precinct #2 had been received, effective October 6, 2003. Two applications have been received for consideration of appointment, but neither person was present in Court. No action was taken and the appointment for Constable Precinct #2 was tabled until October 28, 2003.
- 25. Judge Brown moved to acknowledge the Application of the Indigent Defense Task Force Grant and authorize the County Judge to execute all necessary documentation regarding the grant for reimbursement of the SB 7 Indigent Defense funds. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- **26.** No action was taken regarding additional space allocation for the District Attorney's files. The space allocation committee will meet to try to locate additional storage.
- 27. The Court discussed alternatives in resolving the agreement between the City of San Angelo and Tom Green County regarding the designated ETJ area around the City of San Angelo. This was the only issue discussed regarding the Regulations for Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development.
- 28. There were no line item transfers.

- 4. Commissioner Friend announced that he had attended the Open House of the East Concho Volunteer Fire Department October 11, 2003. He commended the department for the accomplishments they have made. They now have four large trucks, one fast response truck and a new fire station, located off Abernathy Road. They are continuing to accept donations and raise funds to finish paying for the building and continue to upgrade the East Concho Volunteer Fire Department.
- 5. Judge Brown announced that the County Lateral Road Account Report has been received from the State Comptroller's Office and will be recorded as a part of the records.

Judge Brown recessed the meeting at 10:34 AM to walk across the street to the Courthouse where the Court will plant a tree on the front lawn.

Following the planting of the tree, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 AM.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING October 1, 2003

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) and Tom Green County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, with its general offices located at 122 West Harris, San Angelo, Texas 76903 (COUNTY) is developed to define and formalize commitments made by each entity for the work program within Tom Green County which shall utilize offender labor services assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - San Angelo Work Camp (W3).

- 1. TDCJ shall provide offender labor services to COUNTY, participating governmental entities and certain non-profit organizations as approved by TDCJ to assist with accomplishing proposed public work projects within Tom Green County. The public work projects shall be within Tom Green County, Texas and surrounding counties. The public work projects shall be approved by COUNTY and submitted to TDCJ by COUNTY, participating governmental entities and certain non-profit organizations for approval by TDCJ.
- 2. The public work projects designated include but are not limited to general cleaning, maintenance, and land clearing. The offender labor service required for the accomplishment of the public work projects will be provided by TDCJ.
- 3. TDCJ shall provide and be responsible for the supervision, security, housing, medical and other services for the offenders care and confinement at San Angelo Work Camp (W3).
- 4. TDCJ shall be provide and be responsible for the housing of offenders and accordingly shall be responsible for the cost of utilities associated with such housing.
- 5. TDCJ shall provide transportation to the public work projects and shall maintain all motor vehicles and motorized equipment to be used for the transportation of offenders to the public work projects. The motor vehicles and motorized equipment shall be maintained by TDCJ in a safe condition and operated in a safe manner.
- 6. COUNTY shall provide laundry and food services for the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice San Angelo Work Camp (W3).
- 7. COUNTY's obligations are as follows:
 - A. COUNTY shall provide wholesome and nutritious meals (3800 calorie menu) for the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice San Angelo Work Camp (W3). The population of the offenders shall not exceed 40.

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- B. COUNTY shall provide up to 40 meals for the offenders (actual meal count each day to be coordinated between COUNTY or its designated representatives and TDCJ), three times per day, seven days per week. COUNTY shall provide:
 - one hot breakfast, one prepared sack lunch (minimum of 800 calories, excluding beverage and dessert) and one hot dinner per offender Monday through Friday with the exception of observed State holidays (see Exhibit A - Observed State Holidays); and
 - ii. one hot breakfast, one hot lunch and one hot dinner per offender during Saturday, Sunday and observed State holidays identified in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- C. Each meal shall include a beverage. COUNTY shall provide adequate portions of each item for each meal in either insulated transport carriers or prepared sack lunches, unless otherwise specified. Each lunch shall be completely prepared and sacked by COUNTY prior to pick up by TDCJ. Insulated transport carriers will be provided by COUNTY.
- D. COUNTY shall, on a monthly basis, provide TDCJ with a copy of the menu from the prior month. COUNTY shall assure that the menus, to include dietary allowance, are approved at least annually by a qualified nutritionist or dietitian to ensure that the menus meet the nationally recommended dietary allowances for basic nutrition.
- E. COUNTY shall provide laundry service for the offenders.
- 8. TDCJ's Obligations are as follows:
 - A. TDCJ agrees to notify COUNTY at least 24 hours in advance of changes in meal types, such as from sack lunch to hot meal. Any permanent increase in the population of offenders will be reflected in a written contract modification.
 - B. TDCJ will provide plates and cups.
 - C. TDCJ shall rinse insulated trays and/or transport containers prior to their return to COUNTY.
 - D. At a mutually agreed time, TDCJ will pick up the food and beverages from COUNTY food service prior to each meal. At a mutually agreed time, TDCJ will return the food and beverage containers (insulated tray and/or transport containers) to COUNTY after the completion of each meal.

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- E. If TDCJ finds any spoiled or unwholesome meals, TDCJ will return the allegedly spoiled and unwholesome food and beverages to the Food Service Manager for the COUNTY.
- F. TDCJ will serve the meals to offenders.
- G. TDCJ will submit to COUNTY weekly the number of meals served to the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice San Angelo Work Camp (W3) for the previous week (seven days). The specific day of the week the meal count will be submitted to the COUNTY will be established by mutual agreement of the parties.
- H. TDCJ will monitor COUNTY food service operations by periodic on-site inspections. TDCJ will perform inspections in a manner that will not unduly interfere with COUNTY's performance of services. COUNTY shall furnish all reasonable facilities and assistance for the safe and convenient performance of these inspections.
- 9. This Memorandum of Understanding is to begin October 1, 2003 and shall terminate on September 30, 2004, unless terminated sooner in accordance with this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 10. COUNTY is associated with TDCJ only for the purposes and to the extent set forth herein, and with respect to the performances of services hereunder. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or a joint venture, to create the relationship of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for the parties with respect to the indebtedness, liabilities and obligations of the other party.
- 11. Either party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding, without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party.
- 12. This Memorandum of Understanding may be amended or supplemented only by a written document signed by the duly authorized representatives of COUNTY and TDCJ.
- 13. This Memorandum of Understanding shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue shall be in San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas.
- 14. This Memorandum of Understanding and any written modifications constitute the sole agreement between COUNTY and TDCJ. Any oral agreements or understandings outside the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be void and have no force and effect.

Amendment No. 5 to Food Service Contract for Tom Green County Detention Facility

THIS AMENDMENT, hereinafter referred to as AMENDMENT, by and between Tom Green County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, with its general offices located at 122 West Harris, San Angelo, Texas 76903 (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY") and ARAMARK Correctional Services, Inc., a Delaware corporation, with offices at 1801 South Meyers Road, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois 60181 (hereinafter referred to as "ARAMARK") is entered into to be effective the 1st day of October, 2003.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Tom Green County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, and Correctional Foodservice Management entered into a food service contract for Tom Green County Detention Facility dated February 23, 1999, for food service at the Tom Green County Detention Facility, and subsequently such contractual agreement was, with the consent of the COUNTY, assigned by Correctional Food Service Management to ARAMARK;

WHEREAS, COUNTY has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding effective October 1, 2003 with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice to provide food services for the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - San Angelo Work Camp (W3).

WHEREAS, COUNTY desires to amend its Food Service Contract with ARAMARK to provide the food services to the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - San Angelo Work Camp (W3) and ARAMARK desires to provide the food service to these offenders; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend said contractual agreement as hereinafter set forth effective October 1, 2003;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants, obligations, benefits, and agreements herein contained, the COUNTY and ARAMARK do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. ARAMARK shall provide wholesome and nutritious meals (3800 calorie menu) for the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice San Angelo Work Camp (W3).
- 2. ARAMARK shall provide meals for the offenders (actual meal count to be coordinated with designated representatives of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice), three times per day, seven days per week.
- 3. ARAMARK shall provide one hot breakfast, one prepared sack lunch (minimum 800 calories, excluding beverage and dessert) and one hot dinner per offender Monday

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through Friday with the exception of Observed State Holidays (see Exhibit A - Observed State Holidays).

- 4. ARAMARK shall provide one hot breakfast, one hot lunch, and one hot dinner per offender during Saturday, Sunday, and Observed State Holidays identified in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 5. ARAMARK shall include an appropriate beverage with each meal.
- 6. ARAMARK shall provide each meal in either an insulated transport carriers or prepared sack lunches. The sack lunches shall be completely prepared and sacked by ARAMARK prior to pick up by Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- 7. ARAMARK shall, on a monthly basis, provide COUNTY with a copy of the menu from the prior month. ARAMARK shall assure the menus, to include dietary allowance are approved as least annually by a qualified nutritionist or dietician to ensure that the menus meet the nationally recommended dietary allowances for basic nutrition.
- 8. ARAMARK shall ensure the meals and beverages are available for Texas Department of Criminal Justice at such times as mutually agreed upon by the parties.
- 9. ARAMARK will allow Texas Department of Criminal Justice to monitor the food services operations on a periodic on-site basis which shall include inspections of the premises. ARAMARK shall ensure that the facilities are made available for inspection by Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

ARAMARK has agreed to provide to the COUNTY the food services to the offenders at the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - San Angelo Work Camp (W3) pursuant to the following price scale:

ARAMARK shall submit to COUNTY on a weekly basis an invoice (application for payment) for the actual meals provided to the offenders assigned to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - San Angelo Work Camp (W3). This invoice shall identify the number of meals provided to the offenders on a daily basis. The price per meal shall be those amounts as set forth above. The invoice (application for payment) shall be submitted to the Treasurer for Tom Green

County at the address reflected below:

On receipt of the invoice from ARAMARK the Treasurer will verify the number of meals by and through an authorized representative of Texas Department of Criminal Justice. The Treasurer upon the reconciliation of the invoice and the verification by Texas Department of Criminal Justice will submit the invoice to the Tom Green County Commissioners Court for its consideration and approval.

Either party to this Amendment may unilaterally terminate this Amendment upon thirty (30) days written notice.

Except as hereinabove provided, said Food Service Contract is hereby in all respects ratified and confirmed.
