- 1. County Judge, Michael Brown, called the meeting to order at 8:03 AM.
- 2. Judge Brown recessed the open meeting at 8:03 AM to go into Closed/Executive Session in accordance with V.T.C.A. Government Code, Chapter 551, and Subchapter D
- 5. Judge Brown reconvened the meeting in Open Session at 9:14 A.M.
- 6. The Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and the Texas Flags was recited. County Clerk, Elizabeth McGill offered the invocation.

- 9. There was no action from the Executive Session.
- 10. Judge Brown moved adopt the Proclamation proclaiming the month of April 2004 as "Child Abuse Prevention Month" in Tom Green County.

 Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

 Debra Brown, Executive Director, Children's Advocacy Center, thanked the Court for the support given by Tom Green County. She presented the members of the Court with blue ribbon pins to show commitment to the prevention of child abuse and presented a calendar with a schedule of events in April. (Recorded with these minutes)
- 15. Mr. William Talley filed a HIPPA Release form, for the record, in order to address the Court regarding requesting a variance to the monies cap as stated in the Indigent Health Care rules. He stated that there are a series of surgeries that need to be done in order to rehabilitate him enough to maintain a job that would provide for his needs. The cost of the series of surgeries would exceed the cap allowed in the policy.
 - Commissioner Weeks moved to deny the variance of the cap as stated in the Indigent Health Care Rules. Commissioner Friend seconded the motions. Judge Brown, Commissioners Friend, Weeks and Easingwood voted in favor of the motion. Commissioner Bookter abstained from the vote.
- 11. Becky Harris, Director of the Roy K. Robb Post Adjudication Facility, reported to the Court that the current population at the facility is 21. She is awaiting referrals from Midland County (1), Kerr County (1), Aransas County (1) and Tarrant County (1). Discharges this month are 3 and intakes thus far are 2. (Report recorded with these minutes.)
 - Judge Brown moved to accept the Roy K. Robb Facility report as presented. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 16. Commissioner Weeks moved to approve Tom Green County's portion, in the amount of \$6,194.00 from contingency fund, of a cash match funding in order to apply for a grant to benefit programs provided by the Concho Valley Council of Government for a 13 County area. Judge Brown seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Breakdown of Services recorded with the minutes.)
- 14. Judge Brown moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with MHMR Services for the Concho Valley and the Tom Green County Sheriff's Department and authorize the County Judge to sign the necessary papers. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 17. Commissioner Easingwood moved to approve request for a full-time temporary relief dispatcher for the Sheriff's office, for the remainder of the budget year, at a salary of \$699.98 semi-monthly plus benefits to be taken from turnover salary funds. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

- 18. Commissioner Friend moved to approve Sergeant Mike McGee to attend an Incident Command Seminar in Aniston, Alabama and for two officers to attend the National DRE(Drug Recognition Officer) Conference in Phoenix, Arizona. Judge Brown seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 20. Commissioner Weeks moved to approve the acceptance of the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Planning Grant. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 19. Judge Mike Brown moved to approve the Treasurer's Monthly Report for February 2004 as a matter of record. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes)
- 21. Judge Brown moved to approve the County Attorney's request to donate a small refrigerator and microwave to a non-profit organization as identified by the purchasing department. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion. Judge Brown, Commissioners Friend, Bookter and Easingwood voted in favor of the motion. Commissioner Weeks voted in opposition. The motion passed 4 to 1.
- 22. Commissioner Easingwood moved to enter into contract negotiations with the asbestos abatement-consulting firm of CET Analytical Inc. of Odessa as the Asbestos Abatement Manager for the Keyes building, Court Street Annex and the Sheriff's Office. Judge Brown seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 23. Judge Brown moved to accept the \$20,000.00 contribution from adjoining landowners toward the paving of Pulliam Ranch Road. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion. Judge Brown modified his motion to include authorize the Commissioner of Precinct #3 to utilize those funds for the paving of Pulliam Ranch Road prior to the end of his term if possible. Modification was seconded by Commissioner Easingwood and all voted in favor of motion and modification. (Applicable letter recorded with these minutes.)
- 24. Judge Brown moved to adopt the Resolution recognizing March 14th- 20th, 2004 as "National Agriculture Week in Texas". Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- **13. Tabled** Consider Resolution proclaiming April 18-24, 2004 as County Government Week.
- **25.** There were no items addressed in matters relating to the Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations.
- **26.** There were no line item transfers.

27. Future Agenda Items:

- 1. Consider Interlocal Agreement between Christoval Fresh Water District and Precincts 2&4 Road & Bridge.
- 2. Consider paving of County maintained portion of Green Road in Precinct 2.
- 3. Consider Resolution proclaiming April 18 –24, 2004 as County Government Week.

28. Announcements:

- 1. The Commissioners will lay a wreath across the street, in front of the Courthouse, at the marker of General Tom Green. General Green was killed in the battle of "Blair's Landing" in 1864 on the Red River. This will be done in his honor to commemorate the creation of Tom Green County 130 years ago. The Tom Green Historical Commission presented the wreath.
- 2. The Tom Green Historical Commission has furnished cake and punch for all in attendance to kick off the Tom Green County's 130th Birthday Celebration
- 12. Judge Brown moved to adopt the Resolution acknowledging "The year 2004 is hereby designated The 130th Anniversary Celebration Year of the Creation of The Original Tom Green County". The remaining members of the Court seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.) Golda Foster, Tom Green Historical Commission, introduced the other members of the group that were present in the Courtroom. She explained some of the

history of Tom Green County including the petitioning for naming of the County by the first County Judge, Francis Corbett Taylor. Judge Taylor wanted the County named in honor of his friend and patriot of the Texas Revolution, Tom Green. She explained that 12 new counties were taken from the original Tom Green County and are now known as Midland, Ector, Ward, Winkler, Crane, Loving, Upton, Glasscock, Coke, Irion, Sterling and Reagan Counties. She presented a poster and a tee shirt, with a picture of the poster on front, to all members of the Court. She explained that the tee shirts are available to be purchased in the County Treasurer's office and that all proceeds from the sale will benefit the Tom Green Historical Commission to be used for future projects. She introduced 2 great granddaughters of pioneer rancher William Kelly were also present for the celebration and to acknowledge the restoration of William S. Kelly's portrait which was donated to the County as a memorial of his service to the County as one of the first Commissioners to serve and future service to the County. Pictures of Francis Corbett Taylor and his wife, Esther Ann Taylor were also acknowledged. The Cowboy picture in the back of the Commissioner's Courtroom will be restored and rehung in honor of it's commissioning during the

Amendment to Management Operating Agreement

THIS AMENDMENT, entered into this the <u>22</u> day of <u>Match</u>, 2004 by and between the County of Tom Green ("COUNTY"), and ARAMARK Correctional Services, Inc., a Delaware corporation, with offices at 1801 South Meyers Road, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois 60181, ("ARAMARK").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the Wackenhut Corporation, through its division, Correctional Foodservice Management, ("CFM") did enter into an Agreement for the management of the food service operation at the Tom Green County Detention Facility and subsequently such Agreement was assigned by CFM to ARAMARK on December 19, 2000; and,

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend said Agreement as hereinafter set forth, effective April 1, 2004.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises in said Agreement and all Amendments thereto, it is mutually agreed as follows:

- 1. Term: The term of the Agreement shall be renewed for a one (1) year period, effective from April 1, 2004 through March 31, 2005.
- 2. Pricing: The price per meal charged to Tom Green County by ARAMARK shall be changed as a result of increases in the Consumer Price Index and are set forth as Attachment A. These prices shall become effective on April 1, 2004 and shall remain firm through March 31, 2005.
- 3. Officer's Menu: ARAMARK shall provide a menu for the Officer's. Meals provided to the officer's shall be identical to meals prepared for inmates, except that ARAMARK shall provide a selection of at least four different entrees as the County and ARAMARK shall agree in writing from time to time. Meals will be charged at the inmate prices.

Except as hereinabove provided, said Agreement is hereby in all other respects ratified and confirmed.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into between MHMR Services for the Concho Valley established and operated as a Community MHMR Center pursuant to Section 534 Subchapter A, Health and Safety Code and designated as a local MH and/or MR authority pursuant to Section 534 Subchapter B, Health and Safety Code (hereinafter referred to as "Center"), and Tom Green County Sheriff's Department (hereinafter referred to as "Department").

I. BACKGROUND

The General Appropriations Act, 78th Texas Legislature, 2003 in reference to funding the Texas Department of Criminal Justice ("TDCJ") included a Rider 68 that states:

"Continuity of Care. Out of the funds appropriated above in Strategy B.1.1., Special Needs Projects, the Texas Council on Offenders with Mental Impairments (now Texas Correctional Office on Offenders with Medical or Mental Impairments "TCOOMI") shall coordinate with the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation ("TDMHMR"), county and municipal jails, and community mental health and mental retardation centers on establishing methods for the continuity of care for pre-and post-release activities of defendants who are returned to the county of conviction after the defendant's competency has been restored. The Council shall coordinate in the same manner it performs continuity of care activities for offenders with special needs.

As part of the Continuity of Care Plan and out of funds appropriated above in Strategy B.1.1., Special Needs Projects, the Texas Council on Offenders with Mental Impairments shall provide a 90-day post-release supply of medication for a defendant who, after having been committed to a state mental health and mental retardation facility for restoration of competency under Chapter 46, Code of Criminal Procedure, is being returned to the committing court for trial. The 90-day supply of medication shall be the same as prescribed in the Continuity of Care Plan prepared by the state mental health and mental retardation facility."

II. STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING

A. The Department will provide new generation medications (see attached list) to defendants committed under Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 46B and released from a state MHMR facility ("state facility") to proceed with trial after a determination of competency ("defendants").

- B. TDMHMR will provide defendants with 14 days of medication upon release from the facility. TCOOMMI will reimburse the remaining 76 days and should only reimburse for the actual time the defendant is in custody pending a determination of guilt or innocence. At such time, a finding is made, the reimbursement will be terminated.
- C. Center, expressly contingent upon approval of reimbursement for new generation medications by TDCJ/TCOOMI, may either:
 - 1. reimburse the Department for providing such medications; or
 - 2. if circumstances allow, provide such medications to the defendant directly.
- D. Reimbursement made to the Department shall:
 - 1. not exceed the price paid by the Center for community defendants. (In the event the Department or the medical provider for jail services can demonstrate to the Center a lower cost than that of the Center for a new generation medication, then the reimbursement rate will be the lower of the two rates.); and
 - 2. be the same as that specified in the continuity of care plan developed for the defendant by the state facility.
- E. Center shall have the right to audit the Department's expenditures specific to those defendants who were committed under Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 46B and who will receive medications under this MOU. Any exceptions will require the Department to reimburse the Center for funds expended outside the parameters of this MOU.

III. BASIS FOR CALCULATING REIMBURSABLE COSTS

- A. If the Center will reimburse the Department such shall be:
 - 1. for prices not to exceed the price paid by the Center for community consumers defendants, and
 - 2. in an amount not to exceed \$244.00 per defendant per month. If costs are anticipated to exceed this amount, the Department shall be required to submit appropriate documentation and obtain prior written approval from the Center.
- B. Any reimbursement period shall not exceed 76 days and will only be reimbursed for the actual time the defendant is in custody pending a determination of guilt or innocence, but in no event shall said reimbursement period exceed 76 days. At such time a determination is made, the reimbursement for new generation medications will cease.

C. Medications provided by the state facility to defendants will be considered as part of the allowable 90 day period.

IV. PAYMENT OF REIMBURSEMENTS

A. If reimbursement is to be made, Department shall submit invoices to the Center by the 10th day of each month for new generation medications provided during the preceding month. Invoices should be sent to the following address:

- B. The invoice submitted by the Department is required to provide a listing of the defendants' names, their identification numbers, and the date that new generation medications reimbursements began for each defendant.
- C. The Center shall submit needed information to TDCJ/TCOOMMI for authorization to reimburse the Department. Such reimbursement shall be made within 30 days of receipt of authorization by the Center.

V. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

- A. The Center is associated with the Department only for the purposes and to the extent set forth herein with respect to the performance of the Memorandum of Understanding. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or joint venture, to create the relationships of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for either party whatsoever with respect to the liabilities and obligations of the other party.
- B. The Center hereby designates Dusty McCoy, or his designee, to serve as the continuity of care worker and contact for the state facility and liaison to Department for all defendants. The Department hereby designates Josie Robinson, or her designee, to serve as the liaison for implementation of this MOU.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Either party may terminate this MOU, without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. Within twenty (20) days after the effective date of termination, the Department shall submit its final invoices for services rendered prior to the date of termination.

The new generation medications that are covered include the following:

Seroquel

Clozaril

Geodon

- B. This MOU and any written modifications constitute the sole agreement of the parties. Any oral agreements or understandings outside the terms of this MOU shall be void.
- C. The Center and Department, in accordance with Section 614.017, Health and Safety Code, shall accept and receive information concerning defendants as special needs offenders.

AGREEMENT FOR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PLANNING GRANT

PARTIES

Pursuant to the authority of TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE §§ 418.043 and 418.044 and/or § 791.011, this agreement for a Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Planning grant is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, hereinafter called the "STATE," and the County of Tom Green hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY," serving as a fiscal agent for the Tom Green County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the STATE has no programmed resources to implement this requirement of federal law; and

WHEREAS, the STATE will receive funds from the United States Department of Transportation to accomplish the tasks detailed in this agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the STATE and the COUNTY in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, do mutually agree as follows:

The COUNTY agrees to perform hazardous materials emergency preparedness planning activities in connection with the project as stated in the Articles to follow and outlined hereafter, and for having rendered such services, the STATE agrees to pay to the COUNTY compensation for these services as set out in this agreement. All services performed under this agreement shall be performed under the supervision of the State Coordinator, Division of Emergency Management (DEM), represented by the Hazardous Materials Training Officer as the STATE project officer.

1. CONTRACT PERIOD

This agreement shall become effective upon the date of final execution by the STATE and shall be completed by <u>August 31, 2004</u>, unless terminated in a manner defined herein.

2. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY

The COUNTY shall:

A. Complete the following project:

A commodity flow study, conduct outreach training, and purchase one plotter as proposed by the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). The purpose of this project is to determine the types of hazardous materials being transported on highways in Tom Green County as a basis for emergency planning and better prepare local residents for hazardous materials response.

- B. Provide the STATE of the following deliverables:
 - 1) Monthly progress reports as outlined in Section 6 below.
 - 2) Monthly financial reports as outlined in Section 6 below.
 - 3) A final project report as outlined in Section 6 below, together with a copy of the commodity flow study produced for Tom Green County.
 - 4) A copy of any contract between Tom Green County and any vendor for products or services related to the project as stated in Section 2 above.

3. SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE STATE

The STATE shall provide planning assistance to the COUNTY in the form of guidance so the COUNTY can timely complete the deliverables listed above.

4. COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

A. The estimated total cost of the project which is the subject of this grant is:

Thirty-two thousand nine hundred and fifteen dollars (\$32,915).

B. The maximum amount payable by the STATE under this agreement is:

Twenty-six thousand three hundred and thirty-two dollars (\$26,332).

C. The COUNTY shall provide a cash or soft match of at least 20% of the total project cost or at least:

Six thousand five hundred and eighty-three dollars (\$6,583).

The soft match may include any of the following expenses that are reasonable, allowable and allocable to the project.

- 1) Salaries, fringe benefits, per diem, housing, or travel expenses incurred by any person other than a government employee while attending training classes or involved in program activities.
- 2) Private contributions such as corporate contributions of facilities or services such as free classroom space.
- 3) Voluntary contributions such as firefighter support, emergency personnel support, and the time of any LEPC member.
- 4) Equipment or facilities used for exercises, whether public or private.
- 5) Facility space necessary to conduct activities for the grant program.
- 6) University students volunteering time to aid in collection of data.
- D. To receive reimbursement for allowable costs, the COUNTY shall submit as attachments to the monthly financial report an original and four copies of all invoices or receipts along with copies of canceled checks or other proof of payment for each invoice or receipt to the STATE for expenses paid by the COUNTY during the month covered by the report.
- E. The COUNTY shall furnish all equipment, materials and supplies required to perform the project which is the subject of this grant.
- F. All payments to the COUNTY shall be made when expenses are paid by the COUNTY, and a valid invoice or receipt and proof of payment for each expense is submitted to the STATE. The total amount of the grant will be paid when all deliverables have been received and paid for by the COUNTY.
- G. The STATE shall make payment to the COUNTY within thirty (30) days from receipt of the COUNTY's reimbursable expenses, provided the request for payment is properly prepared, executed, and documented.
- H. The COUNTY agrees to spend the average of the COUNTY's Local Emergency Planning Committee expenditure for planning activities for the past two years, or
- I. in addition to the COUNTY's twenty percent (20%) cost match for this grant.

5. INITIATION OF PROJECT WORK

The COUNTY shall not begin the work outlined herein until final execution of this agreement by the STATE.

6. INSPECTION OF WORK AND PROGRESS REPORTING

- A. The COUNTY shall, from time to time during progress of the work defined herein, confer with the STATE. The STATE's project officer has the right to inspect work being performed pursuant to this agreement in a manner that will not unduly delay the work. The COUNTY shall prepare and present such information and data as may be pertinent and necessary or as may be requested by the STATE in order to evaluate the progress of the work to be performed by the COUNTY.
- B. The COUNTY's project officer shall render required reports to the STATE's project officer, including:
 - 1) Commencing with <u>March 2004</u>, monthly progress reports in the format outlined in Attachment 1 to this agreement. Reports should be dispatched not later than the 20th of the month following that which the progress report covers
 - 2) Commencing with March 2004, monthly financial reports, with supporting documentation, in the format outlined in Attachment 2 to this agreement. Reports should be mailed not later than the 20th of the month following that which the financial report covers.
 - 3) Not later than <u>September 15, 2004</u>, a final project report which shall summarize the work performed on the project and accomplishments and a final financial report with all remaining invoices for reimbursement, supported by appropriate documentation of expenses.

Monthly progress reports and the final project report may be submitted by mail, facsimile, or e-mail. Financial reports, which require original supporting documentation, and the final project report must be sent by mail or courier.

7. TERMINATION

- A. This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:
 - 1) By mutual agreement and consent of both parties.
 - By the STATE upon written notice to the COUNTY as consequence of the COUNTY's failure to perform the services herein in a satisfactory manner and within the limits provided, with proper allowances being made for

circumstances beyond the control of the COUNTY as determined in good faith and reasonable business judgment by the STATE.

- 3) By the STATE for reasons of its own and not subject to the mutual consent of the COUNTY upon not less than ten (10) days written notice to the COUNTY.
- 4) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein.
- B. Should the STATE terminate this agreement as herein provided, no expenses except those due and payable at the time of termination shall thereafter be paid to the COUNTY. Payment for the work at the time of termination shall be based upon work completed at that time.
- C. The termination of this agreement and payment of any amount in the settlement as prescribed herein shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations and liabilities of the STATE and the COUNTY under this agreement.

8. DISPUTES

The COUNTY shall be responsible for the settlement of all contractual and administrative issues arising out of procurement made by the COUNTY in support of this grant program. Any disputes concerning the work or obligations defined herein or additional costs, or any non-procurement issues shall be settled at the sole discretion of the Department of Public Safety.

9. INDEMNIFICATION

To the extent authorized by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas the COUNTY shall indemnify and hold harmless the STATE, its officers and employees from all third party claims for injury to, or death of, persons and damage to, or loss of, physical property directly due to activities of itself, its agents, contractors, officers or employees, performed under this agreement and which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of the COUNTY or of any person employee by the COUNTY. The COUNTY shall also indemnify and hold harmless the STATE, its officers and employees from any and all expenses, including attorney fees which might be incurred by the STATE, its officers and employees as a result of such activities by the COUNTY, its agents, contractors, officers and employees.

10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The COUNTY shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, and the orders and decrees of any court, or administrative bodies or tribunals in any manner affecting the performance of this agreement.

11. ASSURANCES

The COUNTY assures that no person shall, on the grounds of race, creed, color, handicap, national origin, gender, political affiliation or beliefs, be excluded from, be denied benefit of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity funded in whole or in part under this agreement. Incorporated by reference the same as if specifically written herein are rules, regulations, and all other requirements imposed by law, including but not limited to compliance with those pertinent rules and regulations of the State of Texas and those of United States agencies providing funds to the State of Texas.

12. AUDIT REQUIREMENTS

The COUNTY hereby agrees to comply with the requirements specified in the Single Audit Act, 31 U.S.C. §§ 7500 et seq. (Supp.1999) (Public Law 104-156), as applicable.

13. WRITTEN MODIFICATION

No modification or amendment to this Agreement shall become valid unless in writing and signed by both parties.

Consumer Prices Rise but Inflation Remains Benign

Although consumer prices increased in January, the increase is probably not enough to push the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) to raise interest rates yet. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 0.5 percent in January (expectations were for a rise of 0.3 percent). Year-over-year, though, the core CPI is up a mere 1.1 percent, matching a 38-year low and 1 percent below the Federal Reserve's (Fed) target for inflation. Low inflation enables the Fed to remain patient in raising rates.

There is no doubt the economy is strengthening. We have seen signs of this for the past several months. What remains in doubt is the timing of the Fed's policy to increase interest rates. The FOMC's goals are to promote economic growth and job creation, while keeping inflationary pressures in check. During the past two years, the Fed has cut interest rates aggressively in an effort to boost economic growth. Now that the economy is in recovery mode, the Fed's primary concern is if rates rise too quickly, the recovery may

stall. Several Fed members have recently commented on the slack in the labor market and the fact that inflation remains benign. Economists are therefore predicting the Fed will tighten rates later, rather than sooner. Currently, Fed funds futures are pricing in 25 basis points of tightening in September and a total of 50 basis points of tightening by year-end.

The FOMC will meet again on March 16, 2004. Economic statistics to watch in March are: ISM (3/1), the employment situation (3/5), Retail Sales (3/11), Industrial Production (3/15), Housing Starts (3/16), Producer Price Index (3/12), Consumer Price Index (3/17), Durable Goods Orders (3/24) and Gross Domestic Product (3/25),

As of February 26, 2004, the Dow was up approximately 0.9 percent for the month, the NASDAQ was down 2.0 percent and the S&P 500 was up 1.3 percent for the month.

Sector Review

U.S. Treasuries: Treasury yields dropped (prices rose) in February as fixed-income investments continued to hold appeal since inflation remains low. Yields on three- and six-month Treasury bills rose slightly in February due to increased supply. March is typically a heavy issuance month for T-bills, which should keep rates higher than normal. The yield curve remains steep, with the spread between the two- year and 30-year currently at 325 basis points.

In our Treasury portfolios, we are keeping our weighted average maturities slightly short, as the market presents little relative value in the long end of the short-term curve. At the end of February, one-month bills were yielding 0.94 percent, three-month bills were yielding 0.95 percent and six-month bills were yielding 1.00 percent. In addition, five-year Treasuries yielded 2.96 percent, 10-year Treasuries yielded 4.01 percent and 30-year bonds yielded 4.89 percent at the end of the month.

Repurchase Agreements: Overnight repurchase agreements (repo) started the month trading at 1.02 percent, dropped to a low of 0.94 percent and climbed up to 1.02 percent at month-end. We expect overnight repo to trade at an average 1.0 percent (right around the fed funds rate) for the next several months.

Commercial Paper: The short-term yield curve flattened slightly in February. Rates for 30- to 90-day paper remained flat at the 1.03 percent level, while rates in the 180- to 270-day range rallied, with nine-month paper currently trading around 1.15 percent.

We are shortening slightly the weighted average maturity of our commercial paper portfolios but will look to extend if the market backs up significantly.

U.S. Government Agencies: Discount notes rallied in February as Fed members stressed that inflation is under control and the Fed can remain "patient" in raising rates. At the end of February, discount notes were trading around 0.97 percent from one week to three months with a slight pickup to 1.05 percent for six-month securities. The six-month to one-year area of the curve remains the steepest with one-year securities yielding a 1.23 percent.

We continue to closely monitor the situation with U.S. government sponsored enterprises and will take appropriate measures (i.e. decrease exposure) if we feel their credit ratings are in jeopardy

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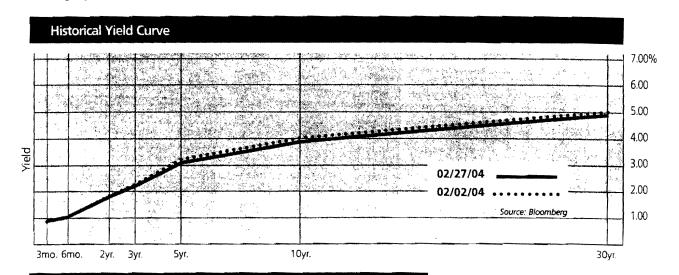

The 14th Texas Legislature created a gigantic new county out of the Bexar Land District on March 13, 1874, and

The respected pioneer Francis Corbett Taylor was the persistent petitioner for the creation of a new county to be named in honor of his friend and patriot of the Texas Revolution, Tom Green; and



Francis Corbett Taylor was the first Tom Green County Judge Whereas, and worked diligently to organize county government and construct the first courthouse; and

The vast territory of the Original Tom Green County comprised some 12,500 square miles extending as far-west as the Pecos River. Twelve new counties would be carved from the frontiers of Tom Green County beginning in 1885: Midland, Ector, Ward, Winkler, Crane, Loving, Upton, Glasscock, Coke, Irion, Sterling, and Reagan. In 1903 the last county - Reagan County was created and the present boundaries of Tom Green County were finalized; and

The 130th Anniversary of the Creation of Tom Green County is an historic event Whereas, deserving a celebration of our rich and unique heritage; and

The Tom Green County Historical Commission petitions the County Judge and Whereas, members of the Commissioners Court, to invite all citizens of Tom Green County and the 12 counties carved from the Original Tom Green County to participate in the series of exciting events scheduled throughout the year 2004 in celebration of our county's 130th Anniversary.

Be It Resolved and Adopted by the Tom Green County Commissioners Court - The year 2004 is hereby designated The $130^{\rm th}$ Anniversary Celebration Year of the Creation of The Original Tom Green County".

Adopted unanimously in regular court session on this the $\underline{22^{nd}}$ day of $\underline{March\ 2004}$ and ordered to be recorded as part of the official minutes of this Commissioners Court session.
