The Commissioners' Court of Tom Green County, Texas, met in Regular Session October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2004 in the Edd B. Keyes Building, with the following members present:

- 1. County Judge, Michael Brown, called the meeting to order at 8:30AM.
- 2. The Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and the Texas Flags was recited. Commissioner Bookter offered the invocation.

Commissioners Weeks and Bookter seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Resolution authorizing Corrections Concepts, Inc is recorded with these Minutes.)

**Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.** (Recorded with these Minutes.)

- 5. Judge Brown moved to authorize Tom Green County's participation in the creation of the Corporation for Texas Regionalism and contribute to the corporation in the amount of \$385.00. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 6. Donniece Stewart presented an in depth presentation regarding the condition and expectations of the homeowners in the Angelo River Ranch Subdivision. She requested support from the Court for enforcement of the Subdivision Rules and Regulations. County Attorney Chris Taylor recommended that this matter be set for discussion in an Executive Session by the Court. No Action taken.
- 15. Susan Counts, Information Technology Director, reported to the Court that they had addressed 200 work orders since her last report. The new server has been installed. New passwords have been set up by the users. Eight new computers have been installed in the Sheriff's office and there are fifteen more to be

installed. There was two hours of idle down time due to storm damage and those repairs have been completed. The file server still needs to be done. There will be on-site training for the Civil Departments of the County & District Clerk's offices, regarding the Fee package, the week of January 10, 2005. No Action taken.

- 16. Cal Roberson, CalTech, reported that the replacement for the backup system has been done, but that the backup software is not supported at this time. The E-mail server upgrade should be completed by the end of the year. Some advantages for the users will be that this will move all junk mail into a separate subfolder to eliminate having to sort through each morning. The user will be able to work off line. He suggested that an E-mail retention policy be established. Looking at a cost analysis for bringing RKR on line with the main server. (CalTech Contract Summary recorded with these minutes.) No Action taken.
- 7. Judge Brown moved to approve the Deed Without Warranty to Torino Properties, Inc. for the North 20 feet of Lot 3, Block A, West Heights Annex, San Angelo in the amount of \$3,400.00 and authorize the Judge to sign the paperwork. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (The Deed is recorded in the Official Public Records of Tom Green County.)
- 11. Terry Reeves, Roy K. Robb Juvenile Post Adjudication Facility, reported to the Court that there have been 2 recent graduations at the facility, bringing the current population to 16. There should be a new juvenile coming in at the end of the week. They have been marketing the facility to several other Counties and have potential of some incoming resident from Reeves County. They have recently collected some back due accounts. They have not received any applications for an in house treatment director at the offered salary and the Court may need to consider a budget revision to increase the salary. No Action taken.
- 8. Judge Brown moved to approve the Radio Tower Lease Agreement with Texas Communications and authorize the Judge to sign the Agreements. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 9. Commissioner Friend to affirm Judge Brown's authority to accept the Felony Family Violence Investigation Unit's grant in the amount of \$41,292.00 with a match of \$13,750.00 and affirm Judge Brown's authority to sign the necessary papers. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 10. Commissioner Weeks moved to accept the HAVA (Help America Vote Act) Grant with \$289,427.00 allocated (7,000.00 training 180,000.00 for accessible voting systems, 102,427 for compliance use) through August 31, 2006, designate Molly Taylor as the Election Official and authorize the Judge to sign the necessary papers. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 12. Commissioner Weeks moved to authorize the purchase of two crew cab vehicles for the Parks Department, utilizing the HGAC bid. One vehicle at a cost of \$22,017.90 and one 1-ton with a diesel engine at \$26,123.95 as specs presented. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 13. Commissioner Easingwood moved to pay the comp and vacation time for the Mental Health Deputies to clear their over time. The motion died for lack of a second. Judge Brown set a workshop for handling FY 04 Compensatory and Holiday for November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2004 at 8:30 AM.
- 14. Judge Brown moved to accept the Treasurer's Monthly Report for September 2004 as presented. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all present voted in favor. (Commissioner Easingwood was absent for the vote.) (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 17. Judge Brown moved to adopt a Resolution authorizing the filing of a Grant Application with the Concho Valley Council of Governments for a Regional Solid Waste Grants Program Grant and authorize the Judge to sign the necessary papers. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all present voted in favor. (Commissioner Easingwood was absent for the vote.) (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 18. Judge Brown moved to approve an Incentive Award Meal for employees or Departments that earn special recognition not to exceed \$15.00 per person.

**Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all present voted in favor.** (Commissioner Easingwood was absent for the vote.)

- 19. Commissioner Weeks moved to permit students of Water Valley High School to park adjacent to Wild Cat Drive and allow WRAP to be spread in the barditch, during the construction phase of the new elementary school project. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all present voted in favor. (Commissioner Easingwood was absent for the vote.)
- 20. Judge Brown moved to set \$2,500.00 as the minimum acceptable bid for Tom Green County Tax Trustee Property being:

**1.499** acres out of the southeast corner of Block 41 of the Mason & Perry Subdivision #4.

**Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.** (Commissioner Easingwood returned to Court and was present for the remainder of the meeting.)

- 22. Judge Brown moved to approve the Resolution authorizing the submission of a 2005/2006 Texas Community Development Program Grant from the Office of Rural Community Affairs. Commissioner Weeks seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 24. The issues discussed relating to the Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations was to review the requirements.

Commissioner Easingwood moved to authorize contact to be made with the Developers of Angelo River Ranch Subdivisions 1 & 2. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the best interests of Tom Green County to apply for funding under the 2005/2006 Texas Community Development Program;

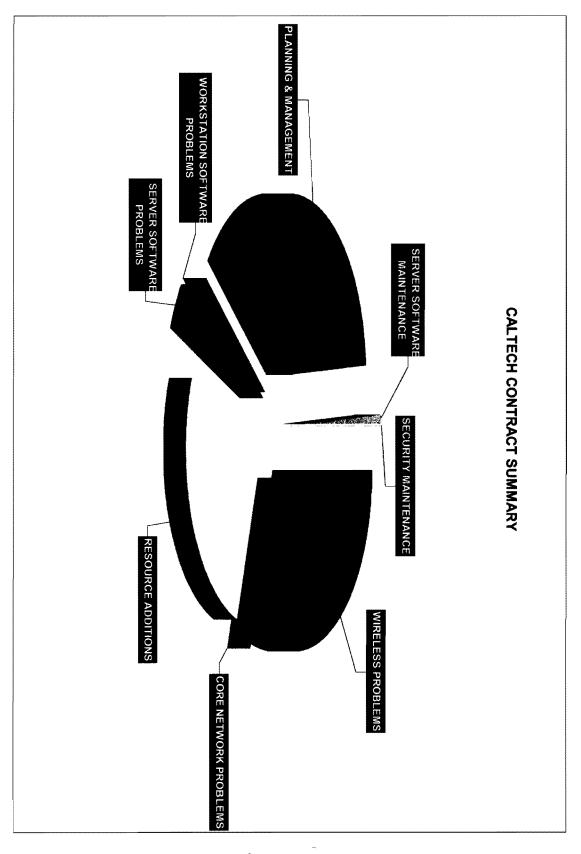

#### TEXAS COMMUNICATIONS

#### RADIO TOWER LEASE AGREEMENT

STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF: Tom Green

In consideration of the covenants herein contained between TEXAS COMMUNICATIONS herein referred to as Lessor, and Tom Green County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, herein after referred to as Lessee, the parties mutually agree as follows:

Τ.

Lessor hereby grants to Lessee the right to install, maintain, repair, replace, and operate the following described radio communications equipment on or in Lessor's property identified as the Christoval Tower, located at 19250 South US HW 277, San Angelo, TX.

A. One antenna system to be located on the side of Lessor's radio tower at the **300 ft**. level. The exact location on the tower will be determined by Lessor's engineers and approved by Lessee so as to avoid interference with guy lines, lighting equipment, or other antennas on the tower.

Flexible coaxial transmission line between antenna and radio equipment в. shall be anchored firmly to the tower.

C. Radio communications equipment to be installed in Lessor's Equipment shelter. Exact locations to be approved by Lessor upon installation.

II.

It is understood and agreed that Lessee's equipment, its installation, maintenance, replacement, and operation will in no way damage the building or tower structure or interfere with the maintenance of the Lessor's tower and lighting system.

III.

Lessee agrees to install radio equipment of a type and frequency which will not cause interference to existing lessees of the tower and does hereby agree to make no changes in equipment or frequency without prior approval of Lessor. In the event Lessee's equipment causes interference, Lessee will take all steps necessary to correct and eliminate the interference. If said interference cannot be eliminated within 90 days, the Lessee agrees to remove his equipment from Lessor's property and this lease will then terminate without further obligation on either party except as may be specifically enumerated herein. IV.

Lessor will not grant a lease, license, or use to any other party for use of this property if such grant would in any way affect or interfere with Lessee's use of the tower. In the event another lessee's equipment causes interference with Lessee's operations and such interference has not been eliminated within 90 days, Lessee may terminate this lease without further obligation.

All installations and operations in connection with this tower, either by Lessor or by Lessee shall meet with all applicable Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications, Federal Aviation Authority, and electrical codes of the city or county and state concerned. Under this lease the Lessor assumes no responsibility for the licensing, operation and/or maintenance of Lessee's radio equipment.

Lessor acknowledges that it, and not Lessee, shall be responsible for compliance with all tower or building marking and lighting requirements which may be required by the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") or the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"). Lessor shall indemnify and hold harmless Lessee from any fines or other liabilities caused by Lessor's failure to comply with such requirements. Further, should Lessee be cited by either the FCC or FAA because this site is not in compliance, and Lessor does not cure the conditions of noncompliance within the time frame allowed by the citing agency, Lessee may terminate this lease immediately upon notice to Lessor.

VI.

Lessor shall be responsible for the declaration and payment of any applicable taxes or assessments against the property owned by the Lessor.

VII.

It is agreed by and between the parties that the Lessor is not an insurer, that the payments of rental by the Lessee are herein provided and based solely on the value of the services and facilities provided in the lease agreement. It is further agreed that neither party shall be liable to the other for damages caused by acts of God, or other acts beyond the control of Lessor or Lessee. Lessor shall exercise due diligence to restore services and facilities regardless of the nature of such cause. If due to acts of God or for any other reason Lessee's use of the tower is interrupted, Lessor shall be liable only for an amount equal to the rent for the period during which such service is interrupted. If for any reason the tower is destroyed or so damaged that it cannot be repaired or should Lessor decide not to repair or replace the tower then this lease shall terminate with the rent paid by Lessee at such time. If Lessor determines the tower will be replaced or repaired then this lease shall not terminate but the rent paid hereunder shall be suspended for such period of time the tower is inoperative.

#### VIII.

It is understood and agreed that Lessee will not permit any unauthorized person to enter the premises and Lessee agrees to keep gates locked at all times. If any damage is caused to the owner's property on which the tower is located, such as fences, gates or livestock by reason of any act on the part of Lessee, its agents, employees, or independent contractors, then Lessee agrees to be responsible for such damages.

IX.

All of the obligations, as well as all of the rights and privileges contained herein, shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their heirs, successors and assigns. This lease shall not be assigned by Lessee to any party other than an affiliate of Lessee without first obtaining the express written consent of Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably be withheld. At the termination of this lease regardless of the reason for such termination Lessee agrees to remove within 60 days all Lessee's equipment and personal property including antenna and coax from the tower.

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v.

Lessee is to make arrangements for installation of any control lines as may be required for operation of Lessee's radio equipment.

XI.

Special conditions:

Jacketed heliax only.
 Includes \$25.00 Electricity and Housing

#### XII.

This lease shall commence upon start of installation of Lessee's radio equipment, which date shall be provided to Lessor in writing within ten (10) days following start and which written notice shall automatically become a part of this lease but, in no event, later than November 1, 2004 The lease shall run for a period of five (5) years. Unless the Lessee notifies the Lessor to the contrary at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the initial lease term, it is mutually agreed that this lease shall be automatically renewed subject to a **two (2) percent** increase in lease amount per annum as shown in Schedule A.

XIII.

Lessee agrees to pay Lessor monthly payments in advance of \$250.00 each beginning on installation of Lessee's equipment, and a like payment on the 1st day of each succeeding month thereafter during the lease term. Said \$250.00 rental shall be payable at 902 Arroyo Drive, San Angelo, Texas 76903.

XIV.

In the event of Lessee's default in the payment of rentals of Lessee's failure to comply with any other provision of this lease, which default is not cured within thirty days after receipt of written notice from Lessor. Lessor may at its option terminate this lease without affecting its rights to sue for all past due rentals and other damages to which Lessor may be lawfully entitled. Should Lessor be forced to collect said rentals or damages through its attorney or by other legal procedures, Lessor shall be entitled to its reasonable costs and attorney fees thereby incurred.

Market commentary Although oil climbed to \$50 a bartel, the US economy appears to be building mounting evidence of continued growth overall. US GDP came in at 3.3%, surprisingly higher than both forecasts and the previous quarter's figure. Lower-than-expected PPI and CPI numbers suggested that inflation remained subdued. Furthermore, non-farm payrolls immersel bu 140.000 licks and currell uncomponent full increased by 144,000 jobs and overall unemployment fell. The economic picture seems to be re-emerging out of the 'soft patch' in the recovery described by the Fed in recent months

On 9/21, the Federal Reserve raised the US benchmark interest rate a quarter point to 1.75 % as widely expected. The Fed re-affirmed that the economy was 'regaining traction.' With core inflation and inflation expectations relatively benign and a modest improvement in the labor market, the Fed policymakers again advised that any further increases in the near future would be carried out at a 'measured' pace. However, the minutes from its 8/10 meeting noted that, 'significant policy tightening will be needed to foster conditions consistent with the Committee's objectives for price stability and sustainable growth. Subsequently, the Fed Funds futures contracts ended the month with a high probability of a November 1/4 point hike priced in and a significantly smaller likelihood priced in for December. The upcoming month's inflation and labor data should help gauge the economic outlook and the pace at which the Fed will remove policy accommodation.

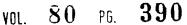

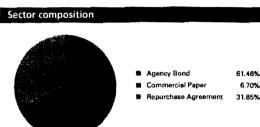

# Another Quarter-Point Increase From the Fed

On September 21, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) decided to raise the fed funds rate another 25 basis points to 1.75 percent. This rate hike marks the third consecutive 25 basis point increase in as many months. The report from the FOMC was basically unchanged from the previous meeting stating that policy remains accommodative and this "accommodation can continue to be removed at a pace that is likely to be measured." The Committee's assessment of current economic conditions noted that labor market conditions have improved modestly and inflation has eased, despite the rise in energy prices. Currently, fed funds futures are predicting another 25 basis point increase to occur at the November meeting, while there is currently a 65 percent chance of a 50 basis point increase between now and year-end.

Treasury prices continued to rise (yields fell) in September as investors remained concerned about the economy's true strength and oil prices reached \$50 per barrel. Also, while corporations reported better than expected earnings for the second quarter, guidance for the remainder of the year fell below expectations. Equities also underperformed for the guarter, fueling demand for

# **Sector Review**

U.S. Treasuries: Treasuries rallied in September as oil prices reached \$50 per barrel and statistics continue to reveal a sluggish economy. At month-end, three-month bills were yielding 1.67 percent and six-month bills were yielding 1.99 percent. Two-year Treasuries yielded 2.60 percent, the five-year, 3.73 percent and the 10-year 4.12 percent.

In our Treasury portfolios, we are keeping our weighted average maturities short as we anticipate another Fed tightening in November and the six-month to one-year area of the curve presents little relative value.

**Repurchase Agreements:** Overnight repurchase agreements (repo) started the month trading at 1.50 percent, dropped to a low of 1.48 percent and climbed up to 1.75 percent at monthend. We expect repo to trade, on average, around the fed funds target rate of 1.75 percent until the next FOMC meeting, when we expect another 25 basis point increase in the overnight fed funds rate.

**Commercial Paper:** Rates on commercial paper continue to trade rich to agency paper as supply remains light. In our commercial paper portfolios, we have targeted our weighted average maturities in the low 40s as the Fed continues its measured pace to a more neutral fed funds rate. At the end of September, three-month commercial paper (top tier) was yielding

Treasuries. The outlook for the fourth quarter is mixed with investors looking for proof that the economy is truly gaining traction. We expect that the FOMC will decide to raise the fed funds rate another 25 basis points at the November 10 meeting, but whether another quarter point increase will follow in December will depend upon economic data.

The FOMC will meet again on November 10, 2004. Economic statistics to watch in October are: ISM Manufacturing (10/1), Employment Report (10/8), Producer Price Index (10/15), Retail Sales (10/15), Consumer Price Index (10/19), Durable Goods Orders (10/27), Existing Home Sales (10/25), Consumer Confidence (10/26), Gross Domestic Product (GDP, 10/29), and Chicago Purchasing Manager (10/29).

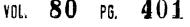
As of September 30, 2004, the Dow was down approximately 0.9 percent for the month (down 3.6 percent year to date), the NASDAQ was up 3.2 percent (down 5.3 percent year to date) and the S&P500 was up 0.9 percent for the month (up 0.2 percent year to date).

1.86 percent, six-month paper, 2.05 percent and nine-month paper, 2.16 percent.

U.S. Government Agencies: Agency news returned to the headlines in September when Fannie Mae accounting issues arose. The regulatory body that oversees Fannie Mae, the Office of Federal Housing Enterprise Oversight, released a report accusing Fannie Mae executives of a wide range of accounting abuses, including intentionally deferring expenses in at least one quarter to meet analysts' earnings expectations. Both the SEC and the Department of Justice have launched investigations to examine the allegations. S&P has affirmed the senior debt rating of AAA, but has put the subordinated debt and preferred stock on watch for possible downgrade. While we feel these are very serious issues for Fannie Mae, the company has taken steps to address them — including an agreement to increase its capital requirement by 30 percent. At this time, we are taking measures to diversify our agency positions but do not feel it necessary to reduce our current Fannie Mae exposure at this time. We will continue to monitor this situation on a daily basis.

At the end of the month, discount notes were trading around 1.66 percent for three-months with a pickup to 1.85 percent for six-month securities, 2.00 percent for nine-months and 2.15 percent for one-year securities. In our agency portfolios, we are targeting a short duration of around 40 days in anticipation of higher rates ahead.

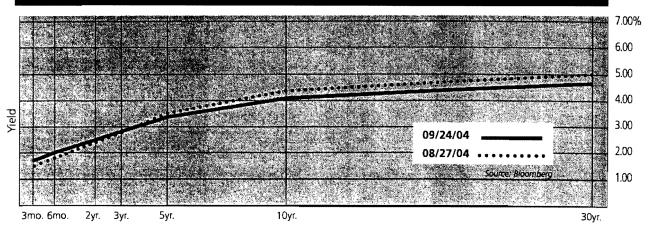
