- **D.** Acknowledged the receipt of the results of Modified Compliance Evaluation Investigation conducted by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality as it pertained to petroleum storage tanks at the County Shop.
- **E.** Affirmed Judge Brown's authority to sign all documents relating to the Indigent Defense Discretionary Grant Program. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- **F.** Acknowledged the designation of Court Clerk as a part-time employee for Justice of the Peace, Precinct #2, as a matter of record.
- **G.** Accepted the Fee Collection Reports by Justices of the Peace for Precincts 1,2,3&4 for October 2004, pursuant to Section 114.044 of the Local Government Code as a matter of Record. (Filed in the County Clerk's Office)

- **H.** Accepted the Indigent Health Care Monthly 105 Report of Expenditures for October 2004 as a matter of record. (Recorded with these minutes.) **All voted in favor of the motion.**
- 9. There was no Executive Session; therefore there was no action.
- 11. J. Nicholson Meindl, Attorney representing Blood System, Inc., a non-profit corporation that has blood collected from Blood Centers all over the United States and one is located in San Angelo. There was a Public Hearing held in the Wells Fargo Bank Board Room this morning for the purpose of hearing public input regarding the Tax-Exempt Bond Financing to be issued by the Arizona Health Facilities Authority for the benefit of Blood Systems, Inc. for the improvement of their infrastructure. There was no participation in the Public Hearing. Requesting approval by the Court for the Resolution.

Judge Brown moved to approve a Resolution approving the Tax-Exempt Bond Financing to be issued by the Arizona Health Facilities Authority for the benefit of Blood Systems, Inc. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all present voted in favor. (Commissioner Bookter was absent.) (Recorded with these minutes.)

- 12. The issues discussed relating to the Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations were:
 - 1. Angelo River Ranch Subdivisions 1 & 2.

Angela Schultz and Donniese Stewart addressed the Court again, stating that they did not understand the suggestion to hire an attorney or the intent of a joint meeting between the developers, previous land owner, engineers and their attorneys, as well as the current subdivision residents (and their attorney), Commissioner Easingwood, the County Attorney and the County's Counsel.

Commissioner Easingwood explained to the homeowners that he has been pursuing answers to the problems, even though he has not directly contacted the homeowners with his pursuits and research.

Keith Davis, Counsel for the County, explained that mediation and discussion should be done prior to filing any lawsuits to help ease the financial burden on all concerned. He also explained that the rules and regulations that applied to this subdivision were adopted October 3, 1983.

Judge Brown moved to suspend approval of any other subdivision until a workshop can be held to establish bond rules and regulations. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion.

Judge Brown rescinded his motion and Commissioner Friend rescinded his second.

Judge Brown moved to adopt bonding requirements or financial guarantee in lieu of bond pursuant to Local Government Code 232.004 or 232.005 of the State of Texas to be used as financial guarantees for roads, streets, and drainage requirements for any subdivision in Tom Green County. Commissioner Friend seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

There will be a future workshop to discuss Engineering firms that can contract to verify that the requirements are met and to work out other details involving enforcement issues.

Commissioner Weeks has received a request to create another one-way street around the Grape Creek Elementary to help with the traffic flow. Public Hearing will need to be held to address this request.

- 10. Judge Brown moved to approve the Replat of Tract 2, Jacobs Addition as presented. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion and all voted in favor.
- 13. There were no line item transfers.
- 14. Future Agenda Items Discussed:
 - 1. Workshop to discuss Subdivision Regulations and enforcement issues will be December 2nd, 2004.
- 15. Announcements:

 - 2. November 23rd, 2004 the next regular Commissioners Court meeting.

RESOLUTION APPROVING A TAX-EXEMPT BOND FINANCING TO BE ISSUED BY THE ARIZONA HEALTH FACILITIES AUTHORITY TO BENEFIT BLOOD SYSTEMS, INC.

WHEREAS, Blood Systems, Inc. (known primarily through its community blood centers as United Blood Services), a nonprofit corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of Arizona (the "Borrower"), has requested that the Arizona Health Facilities Authority (the "Authority") issue bonds in one or more series in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$55,000,000 (the "Bonds") for the purpose of, among other things, financing or refinancing the acquisition of land for and the acquisition, construction, improvement, equipping, renovation, rehabilitation, and/or remodeling of capital projects (the "Financing") at certain blood centers, research, health care and related administrative facilities owned and operated by the Borrower, including a new approximately 17,800 square foot blood center (the "Facilities") to be located in the County of Tom Green, Texas (the "County");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code"), the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority must be approved by the County because the Facilities are located within the territorial limits of the County;

WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court of the County (the "Commissioner's Court") is the elected legislative body of the County and is one of the applicable elected representatives required to approve the issuance of the Bonds under Section 147(f) of the Code;

WHEREAS, the Authority has requested that the Commissioner's Court approve the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority in order to satisfy the public approval requirement of Section 147(f) of the Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 147(f) of the Code, following notice duly given, a public hearing (the "Public Hearing") was held by a representative of the Authority (the "Hearing Officer"), for the benefit of the County of Tom Green, Texas, regarding the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is a copy of the minutes of the Public Hearing as provided to the Commissioner's Court by the Hearing Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner's Court now desires to approve the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority;
