- H. Accepted the Fee Collection Report for January 2006 by Justice of the Peace Precinct #1 (\$22,735.00-216 defendants), Precinct #2 (\$40,795.00-381 defendants), Precinct #3 (35,945.00-403 defendants) & Precinct #4 (28,374.33-215 defendants) pursuant to Section 114.044 of the Local Government Code as a matter of record. (Filed in the County Clerk's Office.)
- I. Approved the donation of shelving to a non-profit organization.

- J. Set March 10, 2006 as the opening date for RFB 06-010 "Parking Lot Expansion for the Edd B. Keyes Building."
- K. Approved the base salary for newly elected officials for FY 2006 at 5% increase over FY 2005 base salary.
- L. Approved request from Verizon Southwest to construct a communication line within the right-of-way of a county road to bore 50 feet under John Curry Road from the south right- of –way to the north right-of-way, near Christoval, Texas, by placing a buried drop wire and a 2 inch PVC pipe at a minimum depth of 24 inches.
- M. Approved a request from Verizon Southwest to construct a communication line within the right-of-way of a county road by burying a drop wire 3 feet in west right-of-way for a distance of 390 feet then bore 25 feet to the east right-of-way with a 1.25 inch poly pipe with the drop inside; located at 6602 Treece Road, 1 mile north of US Highway 87, with all drop wire and poly pipe placed a minimum depth of 24 inches.
- N. Approved an exemption from the bid process as stated in LGC 262.024 for the purchase of a vehicle from the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS).
- **O.** Accepted the Extension Service Monthly Schedule of Travel for January 2006 as a matter of record. (Recorded with these minutes.)

The motion passed 5-0.

- 5. Judge Brown tabled the request for approval of Memorandum of Understanding with SAISD for ACES for further clarification.
- 6. Commissioner Easingwood moved to utilize a construction manager at risk and issue an RFP for the repairs of the walls in the Courthouse basement. Commissioner Floyd seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.
- 7. Judge Brown moved to authorize the hiring of a temporary employee for the Facilities Maintenance Department during the recuperation time of a current employee who is out with a work related injury. Commissioner Bookter seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.
- 16. Commissioner Hoelscher moved to allow the East Concho Volunteer Fire Department, a 501C organization, not a corporation, to name Tom Green County as their government entity on Grant Applications, which will allow them to apply for grants that will assist them in purchasing coveralls, gloves and helmets at a reduced rate that are better suited for battling grass fires,

workmen's comp insurance and will allow them to apply for tuition grants to A&M Fire Training Academy, as well as several other grant opportunities. Commissioner Floyd seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.

- 17. Commissioner Floyd moved to move\$12,500.00 from the RKR fund and allow up to 25% of the original budgeted amount for the Volunteer Fire Departments (based upon written request with itemized expenses incurred) into a fund to be utilized for the increased expenses brought on by the excessive amount of fires this year. Judge Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.
- 8. Commissioner Easingwood moved to adopt a Resolution and authorize the Tom Green County Sheriff's Crisis Intervention Unit to submit a Victim's of Crime Act Grant application in order to continue the program from the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's Office and authorize the County Judge to sign the necessary papers. Judge Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 9. Judge Brown moved to approve the Agreement to House Inmates between Reagan County and Tom Green County at an increase from \$30.00 per day to \$33.00 per day. Commissioner Bookter seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- 10. Commissioner Floyd moved to accept the presentation of the Tom Green County Sheriff's Department's Racial Profiling Report, as presented by Chief Deputy Truman Richey, stating that no complaints had been received. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0. (Filed with the County Clerk)
- 11 & 12. Judge Brown moved to Accept the "Thermal Eye" equipment from the U.S. Army's Technology Transfer Program at no cost to the County, approve the government funding for out of state travel and authorize CID Sgt. Barry Moore to travel to Albuquerque, New Mexico for training on the use of the "Thermal Eye", as required before the transfer of the equipment. Commissioner Floyd seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0. (Commissioner Bookter absent for the vote.)
- 5. Commissioner Easingwood moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with modifications to paragraphs 17, 18, & 19 and proviso that insurance accepted benefits out weigh the possibility of liability to the County effective February 1, 2006 through May 31, 2006, including a 30 day out clause as presented by Legal Counsel, Keith Davis, between San Angelo Independent School District and Tom Green County for the benefit of ACES (alternative Education program) to be conducted in the portable building adjacent to the

Juvenile Justice Center. Authorize Judge Brown to sign the modified MOU upon completion of the revision. Commissioner Hoelscher seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0. (Judge Brown absent for the vote.)

- 13. Judge Brown moved to approve Amendment #10 to the Management Operating Agreement between Tom Green County and ARAMARK regarding an increase in the price of meals for inmates. Commissioner Easingwood seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0. (Recorded with these minutes.)
- **14.** The Quarterly Tom Green County Data Systems Report was tabled until the next meeting.
- 15. Commissioner Easingwood moved to authorize payment of the balance due to Texas Political Subdivisions as a result of the Workers Comp Audit for FY 2005 with the amount not to exceed \$27,330.00 with funds coming from the Workers Comp line item. Judge Brown seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.
- **18.** Issues relating to the Wind Turbine Projects in Tom Green County were tabled until the next meeting.
- **19.** There was no report regarding the Hemphill Wells Building/Library Committee Report.
- **20.** There were no issues discussed relating to the Tom Green County Subdivision and Manufactured Home Rental Community Development Regulations.
- **21.** There were no line item transfers.

AGREEMENT TO HOUSE INMATES

§

This agreement is made and entered into by and between Reagan County and Reagan County Sheriff (herein "Reagan County"), and the undersigned County Judge and County Sheriff, (herein "Contracting County"), and voids all previous agreements between Reagan County and Contracting County WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Contracting County desires to house and provide beds at the Reagan County Law Enforcement Center (RCLEC) for inmates in the custody of Contracting County; and

WHEREAS, Reagan County, when space is available, has additional space and beds in the RCLEC to house inmates from Contracting County; and

WHEREAS, all inmates from Contracting County shall be housed and beds furnished in the RCLEC in accordance with a Jail Plan approved by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. RCLEC may house any amount of inmates for Contracting County as bed space is available, at the discretion of the Sheriff of Contracting County or his successor in office.
- 2. The following consideration shall be paid to Reagan County for each day or part thereof for each inmate held in the RCLEC:
 - \$33.00 for each ADULT MALE inmate
 - \$33.00 for each inmate with special physical or medical needs
 - \$33.00 for each ADULT FEMALE inmate
- 3. No juveniles may be housed in the RCLEC.
- 4. The expense of any prescription medications, emergency care, and other medical needs of any inmate shall be the responsibility of Contracting County. Reagan County shall provide certain non-prescription medications for inmates at no cost to Contracting County. However, RCLEC reserves the right to charge a small fee to any inmate for non-prescription medication and medical services rendered, ie...facility nurse. Notification will be made to Contracting County prior to any appointment being made for any inmate to see any physician or the facility Doctor. Any inmate

- requiring emergency medical care will be transported by BLVFD to Reagan Memorial Hospital at Contracting County's expense. Notification will be given to Contracting County as soon as feasible.
- 5. Transportation to and from RCLEC of inmates of Contracting County will be made by RCLEC, dependant upon the availability of transportation officer(s).
- 6. Should an inmate become disruptive or causes a disturbance while housed in the RCLEC, the inmate may be returned to Contracting County or exchanged for another inmate from Contracting County, with the expense of the return or exchange charged to Contracting County.
- 7. Reagan County reserves the right to screen all inmates from Contracting County for communicable diseases. Reagan County reserves the right to refuse to house any inmate of Contracting County if the inmate has or is suspected to have contracted a communicable disease.
- 8. Any or all of Contracting County's inmates are subject to early pickup at the discretion of the Sheriff of Reagan County or his designee.
- 9. Contracting County shall contact Reagan County prior to transporting inmates to the RCLEC.
- 10. Inmates of Contracting County shall be required to abide by all policies, procedures, and regulations of the RCLEC.
- 11. Contracting County shall provide a completed Texas Uniform Health Status Update form at the time Reagan County accepts custody of any inmate from Contracting County other than an initial arrest. An Inmate Intake Sheet shall be furnished to RCLEC upon the arrival of any inmate on an initial arrest.
- 12. All payments made pursuant to this Agreement shall be received no later than the 10th day of the month following the month in which services were rendered, or pursuant to other arrangements made between Reagan County and Contracting County which are mutually agreeable. Amendment No. 10 to Management Operating Agreement

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the Wackenhut Corporation, through its Correctional Foodservice Management, ("CFM") did enter into an Agreement, dated February 23, 1999, for the management of the food service operation at the Tom Green County Detention Facility; which was amended on April 1, 2000 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No.1"); which subsequently such Agreement was assigned by CFM to ARAMARK on December 19, 2000; which such Agreement was again amended on April 1, 2001 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 2"); which was amended on February 12, 2002 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 3"); which was amended on April 9, 2002 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 4"); which was amended on March 27, 2003 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 6"); which was amended on March 31, 2003 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 6"); which was amended as Amendment No. 5 on October 30, 2003 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 7"); which was amended on March 22, 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 8"); which was amended on April 1, 2005 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 8"); which was amended on April 1, 2005 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 8"); which was amended on April 1, 2005 (hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No. 9"); and,

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend said Agreement as hereinafter set forth, effective as of April 1, 2006.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises in said Agreement and all Amendments thereto, it is mutually agreed as follows:

In accordance with Article V (Compensation, Invoicing, Payment and Price Predetermination), the price per meal charged to the COUNTY by ARAMARK shall be changed as a result of changes in the Consumer Price Index and are set forth in <u>Attachment A</u>. These prices shall be effective on April 1, 2006 and shall remain firm through March 31, 2007.

Except as hereinabove provided, said Agreement, dated February 23, 1999, is hereby in all other respects ratified and confirmed.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING SAN ANGELO ISD'S

ALTERNATIVE CAMPUS EXTENDED SERVICES (A.C.E.S) DISCIPLINARY ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between San Angelo Independent School District ("SAISD"), Tom Green County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("TGC"), and the Tom Green County Juvenile Probation Department ("TGCJPD") is entered under the authority of Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, and Section 37.013 of the Texas Education Code. The subject of the MOU is the facility for the operation of SAISD's Alternative Campus Extended Services ("A.C.E.S."), a disciplinary alternative education program in accordance with Section 37.008 of the Texas Education Code, and the services to be provided in that program by the TGCJPD. The location of the program is the Tom Green County Juvenile Justice Center ("JJC"), 1253 W. 19th Street, San Angelo, Tom Green County, Texas.

PURPOSE AND BENEFIT

- 1. SAISD, TGC, and TGCJPD enter this MOU for the purpose of providing an additional disciplinary alternative education program for SAISD that will also have support and assistance from TGCJPD through assignment of one or more juvenile probation officers to the program, in accordance with the terms of the MOU. The A.C.E.S. program will serve those SAISD students who are persistent or serious offenders who have not been successful in the SAISD's Carver Learning Center ("CLC").
- 2. SAISD will benefit from this MOU by having an additional, more structured setting as an alternative to expulsion for those students whose school conduct would otherwise result in expulsion. TGCJPD will benefit by having an opportunity to more closely supervise juvenile offenders and to provide additional services to those individuals.

TERM, TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT

- 3. This MOU shall be effective February 1, 2006, and will continue until May 31, 2006. On June 1, 2006, the MOU will renew for a one-year period, June 1, 2006 to May 31, 2007, unless any party terminates the MOU in writing according to terms of this MOU.
- 4. This MOU may be terminated by any party by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other parties, with or without cause. The decision to terminate the MOU must be made by the governing body of the party in an open

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meeting, according to the requirements of the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.

5. This MOU may be amended at any time provided the amendment is in writing, approved by the governing body of each party, and executed by each party.

COUNTY RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

6. TGC shall provide and make available to SAISD for their exclusive use and control one portable building located on the premises of the Juvenile Justice Center to house the A.C.E.S. program. TGC shall have no responsibility nor obligation for the maintenance, repair and upkeep of the portable building and premises immediately surrounding the portable building nor shall TGC be responsible for providing any parking facilities to be used in conjunction with the A.C.E.S. program.

JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENT'S RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 7. TGCJPD shall provide a juvenile probation officer to provide life skills training and behavior modification counseling for students assigned by SAISD to the A.C.E.S. program. TGCJPD will make reasonable efforts to ensure that a juvenile probation officer is assigned to the A.C.E.S. program for each year this MOU is in effect; however, the obligation to provide a probation officer is subject to the availability of funds and staffing, as determined solely by the TGCJPD. In addition to life skills training and behavior modification counseling, the juvenile probation officer shall serve as a student monitor and carry out related court work and other probation duties and responsibilities for adjudicated students while assigned to the A.C.E.S. program.
- 8. TGCJPD shall also provide a part-time drug and alcohol abuse counselor for the A.C.E.S. program; however, the obligation to provide a part-time drug and alcohol abuse counselor is subject to the availability of funds and staffing, as determined solely by the TGCJPD.
- 9. The juvenile probation officer and part-time drug and alcohol abuse counselor shall at all times while providing services to the A.C.E.S. program be employees of TGCJPD and shall be under the direct supervision and control of TGCJPD.
- 10. TGCJPD shall maintain workers' compensation insurance for its employees assigned to the A.C.E.S. program, as required by law.

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SCHOOL DISTRICT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 11. SAISD shall provide all necessary instructional staff, which shall include at a minimum a full-time certified teacher and a full-time aide, and instructional materials required for delivering an educational program, in accordance with Texas Education Code Section 37.008, to students assigned to the A.C.E.S. program as an alternative to expulsion from Carver Learning Center or, in the case of a student who commits an offense that requires expulsion from school under Texas Education Code Section 37.007, from any other SAISD campus.
- 12. All staff of SAISD shall at all times while providing services to the A.C.E.S. program be employees of SAISD and shall be under the direct supervision and control of SAISD.
- 13. SAISD has inspected the portable building and surrounding premises and found it to be in an acceptable condition, accepts it AS IS, WHERE IS, and hereby waives any right to complain now or in the future to TGC or TGCJPD about the condition of the portable building, surrounding premises or any improvements as may be located or to be installed in the portable building.
- 14. SAISD shall be solely responsible for the maintenance, repair and upkeep of the portable building that houses the A.C.E.S. program, for the maintenance, repair and upkeep of the premises immediately surrounding the portable building, and for the payment of all utilities associated with and necessary for the operation of the A.C.E.S. program. Utilities includes water, electricity, heating, and telephones.
- 15. Except as otherwise provided in this MOU, SAISD shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with operation of the A.C.E.S. program, including the equipment, materials and supplies as well as any additional wiring or cabling required to outfit the portable building so that it is suitable for the delivery of the educational program.

INSURANCE

- 16. In consideration for the use of the portable building, SAISD shall reimburse TGC for its cost of property and casualty insurance on the portable building sufficient to cover the replacement cost of the facility and any existing improvements. SAISD shall obtain and maintain property and casualty insurance sufficient to cover the furniture, equipment, supplies, and other SAISD personal property associated with the A.C.E.S. program.
- 17. SAISD shall maintain in effect during the term of this MOU insurance coverage as set forth and shall furnish certificates of insurance to TGC and TGCJPD. Subject to the approval of the Interlocal Risk Pool through which the

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following coverage is provided, TGC and TGCJPD shall be named as an additional insured on the policies. SAISD shall furnish certificates of insurance to TGC and TGCJPD within 15 days of the execution of this MOU and shall provide certificates on an annual basis thereafter, during the term of the MOU and any renewals. SAISD's coverage shall be written for not less than limits of liability as follows:

- a. Educators Legal Liability including Employment-Practices Liability: \$1,000,000.00
- b. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Covering All Owned, Nonowned and Hired Vehicles:

Bodily Injury-\$100,000.00 per person; \$300,000.00 per accident

Property Damage per accident -\$100,000.00

- c. Workers' Compensation: Statutory Benefits
- d. General Liability: Each Occurrence Limit \$1,000,000.00

SAISD shall give 30 days notice written notice to TGC and TGCJPD before these insurance coverages are canceled or materially changed. Within such 30 day period, SAISD covenants that it will provide other suitable policies of insurance in lieu of those about to be canceled or materially changed so as to maintain in effect the coverage requirementss. Failure or refusal of the SAISD to obtain and keep in force the above-required insurance coverage shall authorize TGC and TGCJPD, at its sole option, to terminate this MOU immediately.

18. Each participating party of this MOU is a governmental entity, with varying extents of governmental immunity and potential for liability. All parties are subject to constitutional limits on their ability to insure or indemnify other parties. Therefore, each participating party shall also maintain sufficient insurance, as determined by each entity, to cover the entity and its employees from potential exposure or claims for personal injury or other legal liability that may arise from the operation of the A.C.E.S. program.

WARRANTIES

19. SAISD ACKNOWLEDGES AND UNDERSTANDS THAT TGC MAKES NO WARRANTY, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, REGARDING THE CONDITION OF THE PORTABLE BUILDING AND PREMISES TO BE USED FOR THE A.C.E.S. PROGRAM OR ANY OF THE IMPROVEMENTS LOCATED IN THE BUILDING. SAISD AGREES THAT THIS MOU CONSTITUTES SUFFICIENT WARNING THAT DANGEROUS

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CONDITIONS, RISKS, AND HAZARDS MAY EXIST IN THE BUILDING AND PREMISES AND THAT THE PRESENCE OF SAISD PERSONNEL IN THE BUILDING AND PREMISES EXPOSES THEM TO SUCH DANGEROUS CONDITIONS.
